### A FIENDISH GOVERNOR

Terrible Tortures Ascribed to Ruler of Persian Province

Dreadful tales of fiendish cruelty are told of the Governor of Tabriz by Edward Granville Brown, professor of Arabic, Cambridge university who desires the British government to interfere with a man whose sole delight is to torture and kill those of his subjects who profess an opposite political opinion to his own.

Shugard Dewia, governor of Tabriz, writes the professor, is a monster rather than a human being, taking a cold-blooded delight in hanging, stabbing and even cutting men in two like sheep, if he believes them to be unsatisfied with his rule. It is a common occurrence, continues Professor Brown, to see men lying in a dying condition in the streets of Tabriz with daggers cut out, eyes gouged from their sockets, and horses shoed through their bare feet. Deaths through the plentiful application of the whip are common, and the professor asserts that the governor has been known to have the mouths of those he suspected of liberal principles, sewn up.

### Old Oxford Tradition

A striking innovation marked the admission of Dr. Heberden as Vice-Chancellor of Oxford University, for he departed from the tradition of many centuries by reading his address in English instead of in Latin.

He also announced that a letter had been received from the Board of Agriculture stating that the Treasury would be prepared to authorize an annual grant not exceeding \$1,250 in aid of the instruction of forestry in the University.

### ST. SOPHIA THE GOAL

For four and a half centuries the great shrine of the Greek Church—St. Sophia of Constantinople—has been profaned by the Moslem. In all that time the Greek and the Slav have prayed and prepared for the day when the city of Constantine and the shrine of Eastern Christendom would once more be restored to their rightful owners. A Bulgarian, discussing the feeling of veneration inspired by the Church of St. Sophia, said: "There were many Christians in many cities before her day, but Constantinople, by reason of Constantine's attitude toward Christianity, may well be called the first Christian city of the world. Here were originated and promulgated her first great creeds. And is it not tragic that to-day she should be the greatest Moslem city of Europe and almost of the world? That the greatest church erected in all the Eastern world to the honor of the Lord, still called St. Sophia, should be the pride of Mohammed's followers among all their splendid mosques?"

### THE OPPOSING ARMIES

Strength of Allied Balkan States Compared With the Turk

From the best obtainable figures which credit Turkey with an army of 500,000 men; Bulgaria with 235,000; Serbia with 175,000; Greece with 179,000 and Montenegro with 40,000, it will be seen that the troops at the command of the Coalition States outnumber those of Turkey. And the difference is intensified when matters are looked closer into. While Turkey has 500,000 available, it is doubtful if she could employ more than 200,000 owing to the impossibility of feeding and transporting them. It is possible too, that of these 200,000 at least 50,000 would be raw troops.

At the same time the Turkish army of to-day is a far better fighting machine than it was two or three years ago. Whatever faults have been committed since Abdul Hamid was deposed, that of neglecting the defenses of the country has not been perpetuated, with the result that all branches of the service are in a state of efficiency to which they had for years been strangers.

But the Sick Man's foes combined make a formidable army. First comes Bulgaria. With a first line of at least 235,000 highly-trained men. In addition, there are large drafts available from the reserve, and an equally large army of militia.

Their equipment is quite as good as that of the Turks, and in several respects better. They have engineers, telegraph and signal service, transport and medical corps, and Red Cross ambulances. Bulgaria's sole inferiority to Turkey is due to the poverty of the country and the consequently meagre figures being—Bulgaria, 6,000; Turkey, 20,000.

Serbia has an excellent military constitution on paper. Like all modern armies, the Serbian is divided into three categories:—(1) The line, with 104 reserve battalions to be called to the colors on mobilization; (2) the reserve troops; (3) the territorial or militia.

The Servians are armed with the Mauser rifle and have a quick-firing field gun. The material weakness of the Serbian army is due to the poverty of the country and the consequently inadequate equipment and margin of stores necessary for a campaign of a serious nature.

The Greek troops are armed with the Mannlicher-Schönauer rifle, and 300 Schneider-Caspar guns. The Montenegro armed hermen men with the Russian "3 line" rifle of the 1898 pattern. She has a few old field guns.

### AWFUL DEATH TOLL OF SNAKES IN INDIA

According to a report published in Simla the number of wild animals destroyed in India last year was 25,846, as compared with 18,282 the year before. This total included 1,485 tigers, 3,233 leopards and 4,251 wolves. Nearly 172,000 snakes were destroyed, more than twice as many as in any previous year.

This increase is largely accounted for by the offering of rewards by the Burma Government. That this action was necessary is proved by the fact that in one area the paddy fields were so snake infested that their cultivation was impossible.

Altogether 1,947 persons were killed by wild animals and 24,264 by snakes. The number of cattle killed by wild animals was 91,709, and by snakes 10,582.
