THE A. A. U. OF C MEETING

Held Recently in Saint John — One of Best Held in Years — S. F. Doyle and Bleakney Are Congratulated on Good Work.

Messrs S. F. Doyle and L. B. McMillan, President and Secretary respectively of the Maritime Province Branch of the Amateur Athletic Union of Canada who have been attending the annual meeting of the A. A. U. of C. have returned to the city.

It was felt that most of these cases should never have been sent to the A. A. U. of C. but adjudged by our own Maritime Executive.

Mr. Doyle in an interview with the Guardian representative said, that after the presentation of about thirty cases before the Registration Committee we were successful in having our claims adjusted and instructions issued notifying these men that they have again been received into amateurism.

Referring to the succession asked for by Nova Scotia and New Brunswick delegates, this matter was disposed of without much debating as it was felt that the arguments in favor of same hardly merited such a session, and as a consequence the M. P. B. still continues to regulate amateur sport in the Maritimes.

Mr. Doyle stated that it was an education in itself for those present to see the way these A. A. U. of C. officials conducted the business of the meetings. From Tuesday afternoon until Friday most of these men never left the hotel, the meeting place, every delegate using up every spare moment in the interests of the occasion.

MR. BENTLEY'S DECLARATIONS

Findings of Mr. W. E. Bentley, Representing the United Church.

The number of applications received altogether was twenty-seven, of these two, namely Hartsville and Brookfield were withdrawn by the applicants and did not come on for hearing. Another application from Summerfield was presented but no evidence was given and the commission did not consider it.

Continuing Presbyterian Church Applications

No. 1 Summerfield: Was an application by the former Presbyterian congregation, which was withdrawn.

No. 2 Lot 1

Was a claim based on the application that the vote taken at time of union was invalid. This was considered as outside the jurisdiction of the commission and no decision was made.

No. 3 Alberton

In this case an offer was made by the United Church congregation to give the continuing Presbyterian the former Methodist building, organ, etc., and \$250 to assist in its removal. The offer was not accepted.

No. 4 West Point

Was an application presented by the continuing Presbyterian congregations. Mr. Bentley ordered that the applicants be given the right to worship in West Point Church at such times when the building was not in use and on condition that part payment of overhead expense be made.

No. 5 Kensington

In this case the United Church congregation had offered the continuing Presbyterian congregation to give to them the Methodist Church building, now vacant on payment of \$1500.

No. 6 Freetown

The former Methodist majority of the Presbyterian Church congregation who voted in favor of union are now worshipping in the Presbyterian Church building.

No. 7 Clyde River

In this case an agreement of settlement was filed by which the continuing Presbyterian Church gave to the former Presbyterian congregation the right to worship in the church at such times when the building was not in use and provided that reasonable notice be given by the United Church congregation in regard to services, so as to eliminate all capriciousness.

No. 8 and 10, North Tryon

In this case Mr. Bentley gave to the continuing Presbyterian congregation the right to worship in the former Presbyterian Church at such times as it might not be in use and subject to the terms of payment of expense and provided that reasonable notice be given by the United Church congregation in regard to services, so as to eliminate all capriciousness.

No. 9 Hampton and Bonshaw

This application, presented by the continuing Presbyterians, was for the use of the church at Bonshaw. Mr. Bentley gave to the majority group the right of the continuing Presbyterian Church at Hampton, subject to the usual terms.

No. 11 Bradshaw and Rose Valley

In this case Mr. Bentley gave to the continuing Presbyterian Church the right to worship in the church when not in use and subjected to the usual terms.

No. 12 Granville

The parties concerned filed an agreement by which the share in the Manse at Bradshaw should amount to one-third of the interest and to be valued at \$800 and that amount to be paid by the United Church congregation who are now using it, to the continuing Presbyterian congregation. This agreement met with approval.

No. 13 North Rustico and New Glasgow

Mr. Bentley gave to the continuing Presbyterian congregation the right to use these churches, when not in use by the United Church congregation and subject to the usual terms. In regard to the Manse property, no order was given.

No. 14 Marshfield

Mr. Bentley ordered that the continuing Presbyterian congregation be given the use of the church upon the usual conditions, also gave it the right to use the Manse also the right to the use and access to the cemetery.

No. 15 Mount Stewart

An offer had been made to give to the continuing Presbyterian Church at
