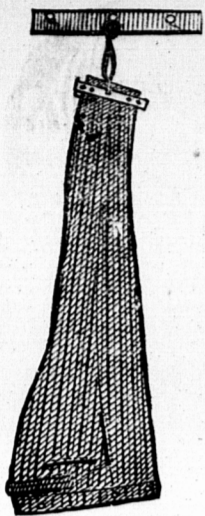




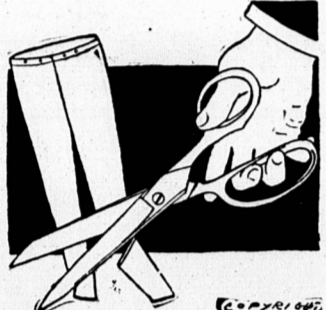

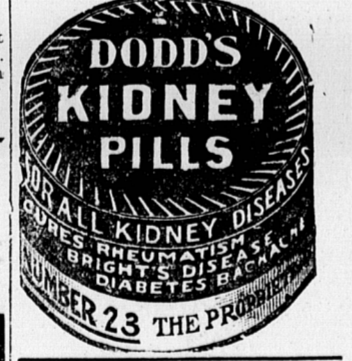

PROGRESS OF PROHIBITION IN CANADA

ST. JOHN, Oct. 13—We people in the Maritime Provinces, where the majority of the people are Protestants, and we people in Ontario where the majority are Protestants, are perhaps disposed to think ourselves a little bit better and more advanced than the people of Quebec. But I think I can surprise you in regard to this question of prohibition. In Ontario 315 out of between 700 and 800 municipalities, have local option, but in Quebec nearly 700 out of a total of 1,008 are under some kind of local prohibition. They have in Quebec an institution that not even the Every Day Club can approach in effectiveness. It is the Anti-Alcoholic League. And who are at the head of it? Archbishop Bruchesi and Begin and the hierarchy of the Roman Catholic church. And splendid men they are. A mighty power they are. Listen to these words of Archbishop Bruchesi: 'I lay hands in confirmation upon 20,000 children in a year, but upon none who are not first pledged to total abstinence.' Of how many Protestant churches can that be said?
 Thus, to a crowded house at the Every Day Club recently spoke Rev. Dr. Shearer, in the course of a brilliant address upon the progress of the battle against the barroom.

CHANGE IN ENGLISH SENTIMENT

He began with a reference to the remarkable change in English sentiment which forced through the house of Commons a licensing bill which would cut off over 30,000 licenses in England and Wales. The lords had thrown it out, but the lords would yet pass it, and even more radical legislation.

Coming to the United States, Dr. Shearer pointed out that half the territory and nearly half the people were under prohibition, and there is hardly a day when the despatches do not tell of some further advance.

THE SITUATION IN CANADA.

Discussing the situation of Canada, he said that he had been assured by clergy and laity that while the present prohibition law is not ideal it is greatly in advance of the Scott Act, as the Scott Act was ahead of license. After a reference to Nova Scotia and New Brunswick he made the comparison quoted between Quebec and Ontario, and went on to tell of the great work the Moral and Social Reform Council of Canada, in which Catholic, Protestant and Icelandic Lutheran churches and temperance organizations are working to drive out the sale in shops. Passing on to British Columbia he declared that while that province is not as far advanced in actual temperance reform yet there has been a greater change of sentiment in the last year or so than in any other province, even Quebec itself.

THE AGENCIES AGAINST IT.

Discussing then the general question, Dr. Shearer said that the four great agencies—religion, morals, science and economics, are arrayed against the barroom, and it must go down, never to rise again. Science tells man what it does to his body, religion and ethics tell him what it does to character and soul, and economics, represented by the employers of labor, make it pay men to be sober, because they discriminate against the man who drinks. The great railways, the great industrial corporations, make this discrimination. The speaker in conclusion exhorted his hearers to exert themselves in behalf of those who are down, pointing out that some of those who most earnestly prayed for prohibition were the helpless victims of the drink habit.

THINKS BEDFORD IS A FAKIR.

MONTREAL, October 13—From evidence collected in this city it is believed there is ample ground for pronouncing the story of Edward William Bedford, about his having murdered Ethel Kinrade, at Hamilton, a fake. This evidence has been secured at the office of the White Star Dominion line here. Bedford stated to Scotland yard officials that he sailed from Montreal after committing the murder, on the steamship Laurentic under the name of Christopher. The murder was committed in February, and the Laurentic did not make her first trip until April, and although the lists have been searched since she made that trip, no such name as Christopher is to be found.
