success of certain prominent evangelists has convinced many that the power of the Gospel has not vanished, that the common human heart is still responsive to the glorious message, when this message is presented under conditions which are not impossible in any community or church. So it comes to pass that in many charges, on the part of the pastors and people there is a very eager desire for the man or woman who, under God, possess the power to move men and lead them to decision. We are afraid that a great many churches will delay special work with the hope that sooner or later the man who brings things to pass will be within their reach.

LACK OF CANDIDATES FOR THE MINISTRY. This is felt in Nova Scotia, Newfoundland, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward Island, and if it were not for the supplies secured again and again from England, quite a number of circuits would remain unprovided for. In the growing West there is a demand for fifty to seventy-five new candidates each year, and from the large surplus of applicants for the Wesleyan Methodist Church in the old land this situation is met from year to year. The general superintendent of our Western Mission, Rev. Dr. Woodworth, has made a careful selection of men suitable for the requirements in that part of our Dominion.

ORGANIC CHURCH UNION. The various committees to whom were remitted the important task of formulating a basis of union, have completed their work for the present. Their findings are now to be submitted to the chief church courts of the parties interested, and then, in some well defined form, for action in the lower courts, where the members and officials will affirm or otherwise the plan of union which involves so many important issues. It is said by those who have been present at the various sessions of the general committee, that the finest spirit of conciliation and unity has marked all their deliberations, and the wonderful unanimity with which the completed basis has received its final touch, augurs well for carrying to a successful issue the most extraordinary proposition for organic union in the history of the Christian Church.
