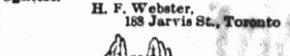

TROOPS MAY CROSS CANADA.

WASHINGTON, May 10.—The war department has decided to double the military force in Alaska, and the plan is to send two companies of the Third Infantry through Canadian territory, so as to avoid the long way around through American territory. Canada will be asked to consent to the passage of the troops. A few individual soldiers have been sent through Canada without objection, but this is the first time the movement of any large bodies of troops across Canadian territory has been projected.

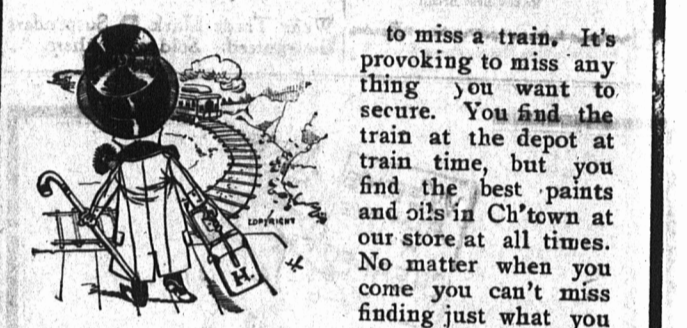
