CONSUMPTION OF DRINK AND TOBACCO.

The report of the Island Revenue Department for the year ended with March last shows an increased consumption of both liquors and tobacco as compared with the preceding year. But Canadians, according to the official standard, are a comparatively sober people. The average consumption per head of alcoholic liquors is small when set alongside of that of Great Britain or Germany. It is also somewhat smaller than it formerly was in Canada. Down to 1885 the consumption of spirits per head sometimes rose close to two gallons. Since that date it has varied from 0.623 to 0.947 of a gallon. Last year it was 0.859 of a gallon. But the consumption of beer steadily increases. Down to 1870 it was under three gallons per head. Last year it was 5.431 gallons, or over 21 quarts, per head.

It may seem strange, with increasing areas throughout the country from year to year in which the open sale of intoxicants is restricted, that the consumption should thus increase. One reason for this is in the growth of cities in nearly all of which liquor selling is licensed. In the older Provinces almost the entire growth of population has been in the cities and towns. Another reason is found in the British and foreign immigrants coming to the country, these being much less abstemious than native born Canadians. CONCERNING CUBA.

Cuba has a little less area than the Maritime Provinces of Canada and about twice as many people. Previous to its liberation by the armed forces of the United States it was a hot bed of revolution and a very plague spot of disease. Now the people are free, prosperous and content and their country is as healthful as any tropical land can well be. American arms set them free and the American Medical Corps eradicated the yellow fever in quite marvellous fashion. And yet Julius Chambers, writing in the Brooklyn Eagle, speaks of "the inexplicable hatred of the Cubans toward the Americans." This will doubtless pass away.

The Cuba of today has a public debt of \$12,000,000 and a revenue of \$42,553,000. Last year Cuba reported goods to the value of \$144,000,000, or over \$75 per head of its population. Cuba has 175 sugar mills producing 36,207 tons of sugar, and produced for export last year \$26,331,825 worth of tobacco. Great progress has been made in improving agriculture and the public highways. Water works are being put into the interior cities. Bee culture is encouraged by the state. There are already thousands of apiaries with over half a million hives producing honey which sells for 45 cents per pound.

Cuba has a permanent army of 4,500 men and a rural guard of over 5,000 men. The post office last year forwarded some 63,000,000 letters. There are 171 telegraph stations on the island of which nine are wireless. Especial attention is given to education and last year 210,000 children

medicinal preparations and for mechanical purposes than formerly. The report shows that there are in Canada 15 distilleries and 121 breweries altogether. More than half of the distilleries and almost half of the breweries are in Ontario. The quantity of spirits actually produced was 5,255,000 gallons. The chief materials used in the production were 58,050,000 pounds of corn, 18,531,000 pounds of molasses, 11,320,000 pounds of rye and 5,766,000 pounds of malt. The breweries consumed 96,386,000 pounds of malt and produced 41,752,000 gallons of ale and beer of various strength. Spirits and malt liquors paid excise duty to the sum of \$9,495,000.

More than three pounds of tobacco per head were consumed in Canada last year. This is a record quantity, and much of the increase was in cigarettes. Duty was paid on 586,000,000 cigarettes, an increase of 75 per cent in two years. In the same period the number of cigars made and taken for consumption increased from 192,000,000 to 227,000,000. All of which would go to show that Canadians are becoming a nation of mighty smokers. The drink bill and the tobacco bill make a frightful total in the annual cost of living to the people of Canada. Six gallons of beer and spirits and three pounds of tobacco per head must be multiplied by five to reach the consumption per family.

attended the public schools. Thus along many lines the progress of emancipated Cuba has been marvellous.

WHERE WOMEN VOTE.

New Zealand and South Australia were pioneers among the British possessions in granting votes to women. In New Zealand the voting franchise was first exercised by women in 1893 and has been since continued. The women have now voted in six general elections there, and appear to enjoy the privilege. Sometimes a larger proportion of the women than of the men whose names are on the electoral roll turn out to vote. The fact of women voting also appears to have a stimulating effect in bringing out the masculine vote.

At the first election in which both men and women voted in 1893 there were 82 per cent of the qualified women who voted and but 67 per cent of the qualified men. In 1908 the proportions were 81 per cent of the men and 78 per cent of the women. This proportion depends somewhat upon the principal question at issue in an election, the women sometimes taking a strong interest in matters in regard to which men are indifferent, and vice versa.

As regards the fear that voting might lead to women neglecting their domestic duties and the care of their children it is pointed out that while the birth-rate is declining in almost all other countries, it is advancing in New Zealand and official statistics show that in New Zealand and South Australia, where women have been voting for eighteen years, the infant mortality is the lowest in the world. So the voting mothers appear to take good care of their babies.

SUPPOSE.

Suppose we had a car-ferry, or even any kind of an efficient steamer ferry, at the Capes, making two round trips daily the following improvements in our transportation service would be practicable:

Passengers could leave Charlottetown in morning or afternoon for all points on the mainland and go on to their destination without delay. And in like manner passengers could come to this city from the mainland morning or evening. This would practically double the facilities for travel, to and from this province.

We should also send and receive mails to and from the mainland both morning and evening, instead of having outward mails only in the morning and inward mails only in the evening as now.

There would be like advantages in regard to sending and receiving freight and express goods. Letters received in the morning

could be answered and the answer despatched by the out-going evening mail and would be in St. John or Halifax at the opening hours of business there the following morning.

Four trips from cape to cape would make the day's run for the ferry steamer only 28 miles as against fifty odd miles for the single trip between Charlottetown or Georgetown and Pictou.

SMALL-POX.
By Dr. J. D. Mc Cue.
In answer to Mayor Chartier's statement in "The Guardian," Nov 4th concerning the spread of small-pox. Stating his opinion that the disease is not infectious, and that he thinks, if a person is to catch it, they will, no matter what precautions are taken, it must be said from a reasoning and common sense point of view, also from medical knowledge acquired by all physicians of today, it is positively known, that this disease is the most contagious of all diseases.

History.—The disease existed in China many centuries before Christ. The PEST A MAGNA described by Galen is believed to have been small-pox. In the sixth century it prevailed, and subsequently, at the time of the Crusades, became wide-spread. It was brought to America by the Spaniards early in the sixteenth century. The first accurate account was given by Rhazes, an Arabian physician, who lived in the ninth century, and whose admirable description is available in Greenhill's translation for the Sydenham Society. Special events in the history of the disease are the introduction of inoculation into Europe, by Lady Mary Wortley Montagu, in 1718, and the discovery of vaccination by Jenner, in 1796.
