THE Stanley arrived in Summerside about half past four yesterday afternoon. She will begin work on the Summerside Tormentine route today.

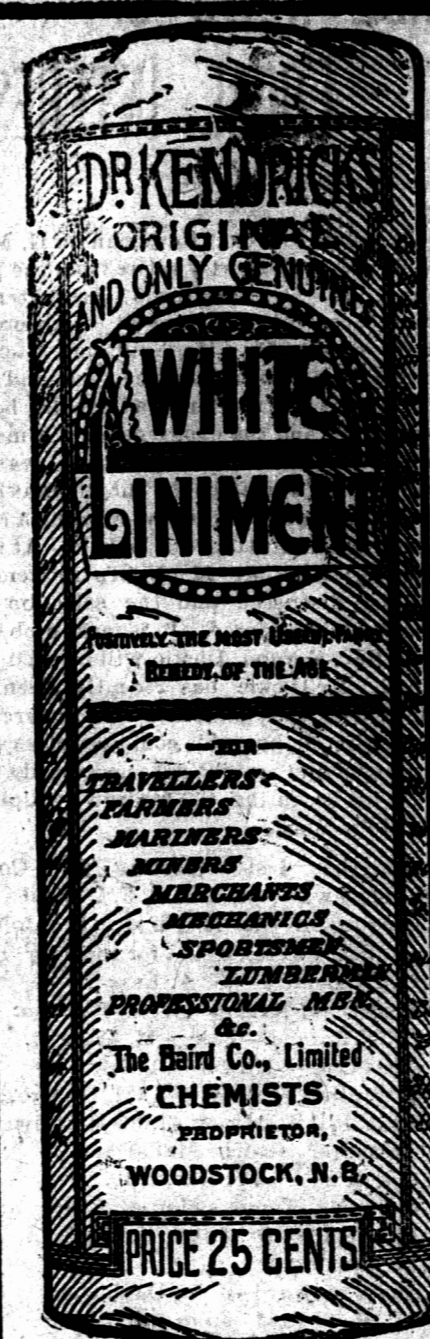

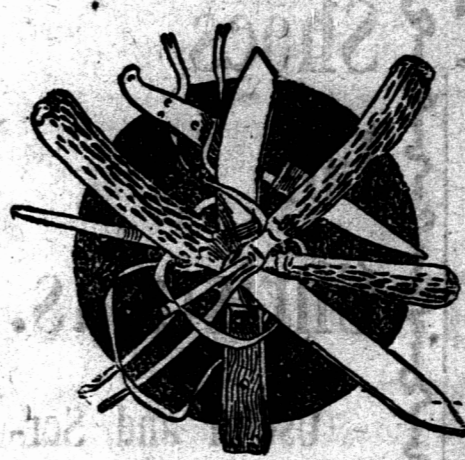
