Apple or green mincemeat pie is made as follows: 2 cups chopped tart Canadian-grown apples...

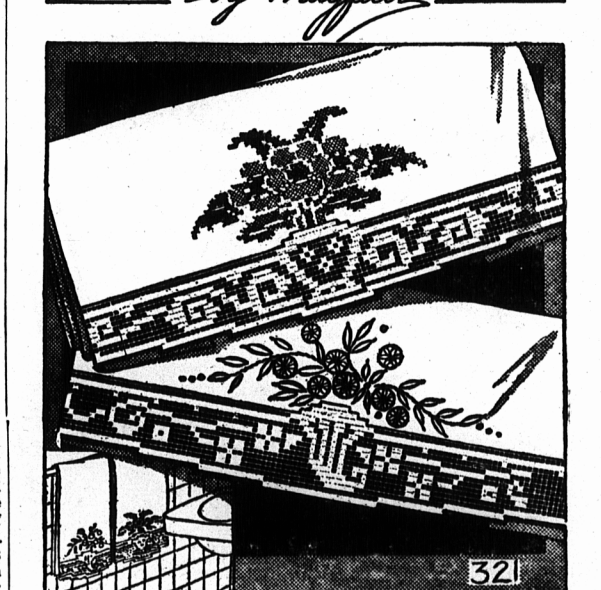
SCALLOPED APPLES
