The Examiner prints an ill-natured and misleading paragraph in regard to Mr. Alexander Martin's letter. It is true that Mr. Martin applied to this paper to have his letter copied from the Examiner. He was told that it was purely political campaign material, and while all right for a Conservative party paper was not of the same value for the GUARDIAN; that we very seldom re-publish letters which have first appeared in another Island paper; and finally that we were treating his letter precisely as we would treat a similar letter under like circumstances from Mr. McKinnon, his opponent in the election contest. The Examiner's more recent attitude indicates that it is being whipped into line.
