THE MARKETS

(Canadian Press.) OTTAWA, Nov. 20—The only change in the egg market is in fresh firsts which are much higher and a good price is now being

offered for pullet extras. Prices on all varieties of dressed poultry are steady but unfavorable weather conditions are tending to have an adverse effect on buyers purchasing large quantities. Toronto, Nov. 20—Arrangements for official registration and collection of Quebec vital statistics will come into operation next month and thus for the first time

Montreal is very firm, storage extras 46, firsts 42, seconds 37, Winnipeg is firm with fresh receipts very light. Saskatchewan markets are quiet. Fresh receipts are practically nil. Poultry receipts are light, due mostly to threshing operations. Edmonton steady, storage extras jobbing 45, firsts 40, extras 35. Calgary is unchanged. Vancouver fresh eggs firm, dealers paying country points extras 58, firsts 56, live poultry unchanged.

MONTREAL, Nov. 20—A fair amount of business was transacted today in the local grain market. Montreal exporters receiving a number of cables bidding for Manitoba wheat for prompt and nearby shipment. There was also demand for oats at advanced prices and sales of a few loads were made. The demand for wheat now on the spot here showed some improvement. A moderate amount of business was done in cash coarse grains in the domestic market and prices generally were firmly maintained. There was no further change in prices for spring wheat grades of flour nor was there any marked improvement in the volume of business. A very firm feeling prevailed for all lines of mill-feed under a good steady demand and small offerings. There was no change in the condition of the market for hay, prices for all grades being maintained under a steady demand for supplies. The undertone to the market for fresh eggs continued strong, though the bulk of the business is at present in storage eggs. There were no
