MONTREAL, Feb. 5.—(CP)—Chicago Black Hawks scored their second straight National Hockey League win here tonight when little Bobby Carse came through with the payoff goal at 17:52 of the third period to defeat Montreal Canadiens 4-3 before a crowd of more than 5,000.

Minus their regular goalie, Sam Lo Presti, who was out with a severely cut eye, Chicago was granted the services of Bill Dickie of the Pats in the Quebec Senior Amateur Hockey League. Permission was granted for use of Dickie for one night by the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association after Manager Paul Thompson had failed in his efforts to get a replacement for Lo Presti before game time.

The switch in goalies failed to spoil Chicago's upward climb as Dickie rose to brilliant heights at times to stem a Canadian team desperately in search of a win to keep its playoff hopes alive. Chicago had to come from behind before subduing the cellar-placed Habitants. The Montrealers moved into a 2-0 lead within seven minutes of the initial period on two neat goals, but Chicago got those back before the period ended.

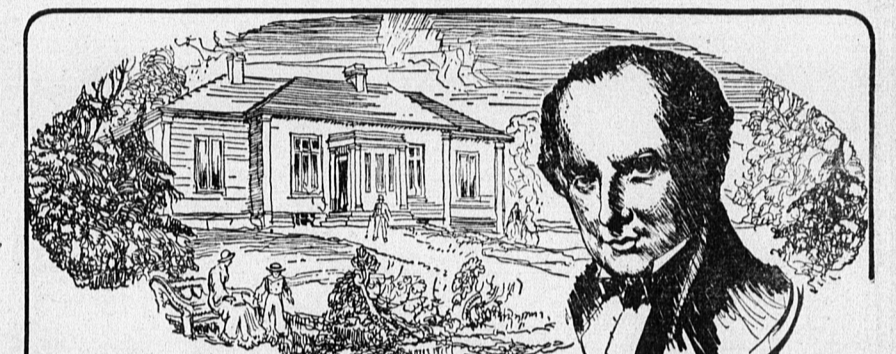
