be the same as the Egyptian and was finally proven to be so. The great difficulty in deciphering them lay in the fact that the writing was composed partly of hieroglyphic characters partly of pure ideographic characters, and partly of picture writings. It was not until 1835 that the full text of these characters were deciphered.

Another great discovery was that of the transcription of cuneiform characters cut into the face of a towering cliff at Behistun, near Persepolis, which had stood for many centuries an unintelligible enigma. The discoverer was Sir Henry Rawlinson. He climbed the face of the cliff in 1835 and copied into his notebook the forms of the mysterious characters. After fifteen years study he succeeded in reading the riddle. This was in 1846.

The inscription was in the Syriac, Persian and Babylonian languages and which he rightly guessed to have some reference to King Darius.

The next find was Ninevah. This ancient city had until the coming of Layard, the great English explorer, remained buried since its destruction 606 B. C.

From the cuneiform inscriptions on disinterred fragments great historical gains were made. Everyone has read of the discovery of Ashurbanipal's library containing archives of Babylonian and Assyrian civilization for thousands of years back. 10,000 of the tablets of this library were taken to the British Museum. The reading of them requires vast patience and jurisdiction. Possibly there are not six persons living today who can decipher the old cuneiform characters.

CHICAGO, Dec. 22.—Work in connection with the prosecution of White Sox players under indictment for alleged throwing of games and in attempting to send to jail the gamblers who are said to have corrupted Comiskey's men in the 1919 world's series will give President Johnson, of the American League one of the busiest winters he has ever had in baseball, he said today, on his return from New York.

It has been rumored that President Comiskey may endeavor to stop the American League in its effort to press the gambling cases in order to have charge of the prosecution himself.

President Comiskey has placed the matter in the hands of his attorneys and more than a year ago set aside ten thousand dollars to be used in unearthing the 1919 world's series scandal.

His attorneys, it is stated, are to confer with state's attorney Robert Crowe, to learn just what can be done to hurry up the cases now before criminal court.

Comiskey believes himself to be the one who suffered most from their dishonesty and that he should be allowed a hand in the prosecution.

CATHOLIC YEAR BOOK.—The Catholic Year Book and Directory of the Maritime Provinces for 1921, has just been issued by the university students of Mount St. Bernard's Ladies College, Antigonish. This volume of some 160 pages is a veritable mine of information concerning the church in the Maritime Provinces, and so concisely and systematically arranged as to make the information immediately available. The calendar section gives a complete list of the movable feasts and holy days while the directory section gives the names and location of all the clergy in the Maritime Provinces, different parishes and missions, the population of each and a recapitulation for each diocese. In the diocese of Charlottetown, for instance, there are one bishop, 56 priests, 37 churches with resident priests, 14 missions with churches, one university, two academies for boys, two academies for girls, one hospital, one orphanage, and a total Catholic population for the province of 48,207. Similar information is given concerning each of the other Maritime Provinces. The book is illustrated with excellent photographs of His Holiness Pope Benedict, the Apostolic Delegate, the Archbishop of Halifax, the bishops of the different dioceses, the principal churches, schools and other religious institutions. Among the latter are included a handsome photograph of the interior of St. Dunstan's Cathedral, Charlotte-town, St. Dunstan's University and the academies. In addition to the exclusively institutional information there are several excellent articles dealing with moral, spiritual and economic problems, all ably written, also a list of books recommended for Catholic readers and much other valuable information. The book is a model of system and conciseness and is a distinct credit to its compilers and editors.

SCARLET AND GOLD.—The Guardian is in receipt of the second annual issue of Scarlet and Gold, published by the Editorial Committee of the Royal North West Mounted Police. It is a magnificent volume devoted exclusively to matters of Canadian interest with special emphasis on the work and history of the R. N. W. M. P. The present number introduces new stories of real romance connected with the history of Canada's great Mounted Police force all contributed by Veterans of the force and all of real human interest and historic value. A large colored picture of the powerful mounted officer and one commissioned officer and one constable, of the famous North West Mounted Police force, entering a large Indian camp in order to make a capture. The sergeant has seized the right hand of the powerfully built Blackfoot, causing him to loose the heavy buffalo knife that he has drawn; while behind a mounted constable sits with his carbine across his knees facing the excited mob of Indians. A half-breed interpreter, mounted on a scrub pony, makes an unhappy figure in a stern scene. It is to men such as the two wearers of the "Scarlet and Gold" here pictured that Canada owes the remarkable safety of life and property which marked the formative period of the Great North West. In addition to this magnificent picture the book, which contains some 150 pages, is fully illustrated. It is a splendid Christmas number and would make a most appropriate Christmas gift.

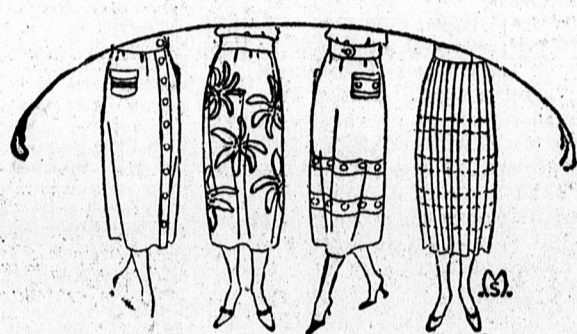
