A BIG INCREASE IN MENTAL DISORDERS

President T. W. Burgess at American Medico Association Deals With Canadian Asylums.

SAN ANTONIO, Texas, April 22.—The sixty-first annual meeting of the American Medico Psychological Association is in session here. About one hundred alienists are in attendance. The meeting will continue three days. It is presided over by President T. W. Burgess, of Montreal, Que. The feature of yesterday the first day, was the annual address of President Burgess on "the history and conditions of the Insane Asylums of Canada." He said that the rate of increase in mental disorders is so great as to call for stringent measures to suppress it. President Burgess denounced the system of making appointments to positions in asylums as a reward for party service.

DANGER TO PEACE.

The Admiralty denies the reports circulated here that Russia has bought several South American warships through Paris intermediaries.
