### A BIG SQUADRON WITH THE PRINCE

### Quebec Tercentenary Celebration In British House of Commons

LONDON, March 15—The reply of Mr. Asquith, on behalf of the prime minister to Sir Gilbert Parker in the house of commons, this afternoon, concerning the Quebec tercentenary celebration, gives much satisfaction. It was especially noted that he spoke of the squadron to accompany the Prince of Wales at the end of July as a "powerful squadron."

Mr. Asquith added that the royal intention gave lively pleasure both here and in the Dominion.

To question as to the imperial government's subscription to the tercentenary funds has not yet come before the ministry, from which it is expected that Mr. Asquith at least assumes an application.

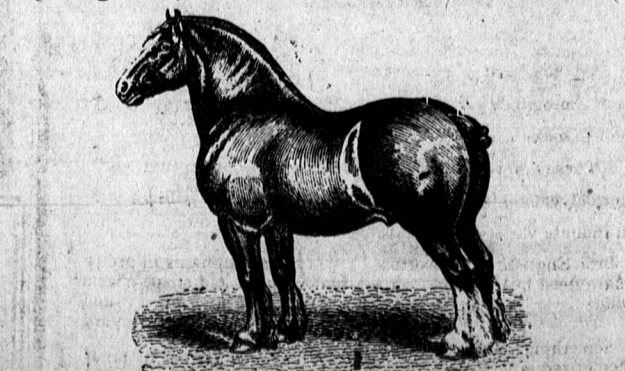
