G. T. P. IS RUNNING THROUGH WHEAT TRAINS TO FORT WILLIAM.

MONTREAL, Oct. 13.—Rumors to the effect that the G.T.P. and Canadian Northern had failed to arrive at an agreement for the use of the C. N. R. tracks at Winnipeg to furnish a link between the G. T. P. western lines and their route to the Lake of the Lakes, have been set at rest by the announcement that this agreement has been arrived at, and that through freight is now being run by the G. T. P. from Edmonton to Fort William and Port Arthur.

The grain for wheat from the prairie provinces to Lake Superior was opened up Friday last, when 80 cars were put through Winnipeg over the Grand Trunk Pacific. At the same time Government Engineer Merrick, at Fort William, notified the Lake Shippers' Association that boats can be used at and land from the Grand Trunk Pacific's elevator at Fort William.

The taking of this traffic over the National Transcontinental line from Winnipeg to Superior Junction, thence via the Superior branch to the lake, is an important step, and opens up a new all Grand Trunk Pacific route for western wheat. Last year the Grand Trunk Pacific delivered to its connections at Winnipeg more than 8,000,000 bushels of wheat. All this grain will now be handled by the Grand Trunk Pacific and Grand Trunk Railway. It is expected that, notwithstanding the higher yield, this year's tonnage over the new route will exceed the amount handled last year. As a matter of fact, the dry season just passed did not affect the northern section of the wheat belt through which the Grand Trunk Pacific passes as severely as it did the territory farther south.

In addition to the wheat business, there is a great deal of general merchandise going into the new settlements, and new towns along the line of the Grand Trunk Pacific, and it is expected that with the opening of navigation next year the effect of the increased tonnage will be felt, not only by the Grand Trunk Pacific, but by the Grand Trunk Railway system as well. This development of transportation facilities is important to all Canada.

COMPLETE VICTORY ON THE TWO MAIN CONTENTIONS.

OTTAWA, Oct. 16.—Seven years ago, when Hon. A. B. Aylesworth came back to address the Canadian Club of Toronto, on the results of the award of the last international tribunal in which Canadian interests were opposed to those of the United States, namely, on the Alaskan boundary question, he addressed an audience smarting under the sense of injustice and somewhat belligerent in its attitude towards Great Britain. On that occasion he notably played the statesman in explaining a Canadian defeat and at the same time, converting an audience at first manifestly hostile to any further implicit trust in British diplomacy, into an audience that at the conclusion of his address, gave a remarkable evidence of Canadian loyalty to the Motherland, by singing with the greatest enthusiasm "God Save the King."

On Saturday afternoon, before the Canadian Club of Ottawa Mr. Aylesworth, fresh from the happy triumphs of the Canadian-Newfoundland-British case against the United States at The Hague in connection with the North Atlantic fisheries award, and with a happier story to tell again concerning the address with a rarely eloquent Imperial note, which caused the audience to rise and spontaneously and enthusiastically cheer again and again, his concluding references to the new cause which Canada had for gratitude to the Mother Country, "Canada and Newfoundland," he said, "had behind them at The Hague all the weight of the British Empire. The very best assistance, which Britain could give was given us. Even if we had been defeated, a closer relationship must have been established between us and the Homeland. The successful result of our case emphasizes among those of us who are intimately connected with it and who know the practical value of British protection and influence, the feeling of warm gratitude, which we have for the Motherland."

A hundred years ago, our forefathers clung to Great Britain in storm and stress. We their descendants have the same loyalty, affection and devotion, with ever increasing cause, and we will hand it down to our children and our children's children, and to generations yet unborn."

Mr. Aylesworth in his hour's address covered succinctly, the main issues of the case, and the significance of the award. In a historical review of the controversy over the interpretation of the Treaty of 1881, he noted that correspondence between the British and American Governments showed that at times the irritation, caused by the conflict of opinion as to American and British rights in the fisheries of Newfoundland and Canada, has been so acute, as to bring war within reasonable expectation. The controversy on either side was a truly notable evidence of the value of international arbitration in the promotion of the peace of the world.

Dealing particularly with the two main issues of importance to Canada he noted that by the award all the territorial waters of Newfoundland and Canada were definitely stated to be within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Colonial and British Governments. For nearly a hundred years the United States had claimed that all the waters outside of the three or four miles of American bays were equally open to American, Newfoundland and Canadian fisheries. The award was a complete victory for the British contention that every bay, about which the question had been raised, was from its nature, British territory, and from that it could be excluded, if so desired, every foreign fisherman.

The other main contention of the United States was that American fishermen from the treaty waters was carried by one of the United governing Canadian or Newfoundland fisheries therein. This contention was carried by one of the United States counsel, Senator Currier, to such an extent that it was maintained that Washington had the legal right to send an armed force into these treaty waters, to compel the fishermen of Canada and Newfoundland to observe regulations made at Washington. The award had established the unqualified right of Newfoundland and Canada to enact laws which would be binding on United States fishermen in all the waters in question.

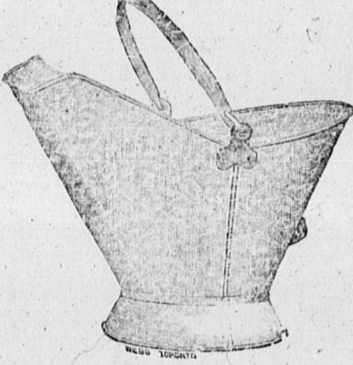
