TEN REQUISITES

The profession of teaching requires a many-sided personality. One must possess adequate knowledge in relation to those who administer the schools, other teachers, the pupils we teach, and to the general public including parents.

THE SMOOTHING IRON OF TEACHING

There is nothing that means so much to a teacher as adequate preparation for the day's work.

PITFALLS IN THE USE OF COMMON WORDS

It is greater than half the total number of votes cast—that is, if the number called a majority is greater than all the other votes put together.

TRUTH, VERACITY

TRUTH is a characteristic of a fact or thing, but VERACITY, which is the capacity to tell or habit of telling the truth, is rather a characteristic of a person.

PERSECUTE PROSECUTE

PERSECUTE means to pursue with the intent to injure. PROSECUTE means to pursue with the object of accomplishing something, or to pursue with the desire to secure redress for a wrong.

MAJORITY, PLURALITY

A MAJORITY is the larger of two numbers considered as parts of a whole. In counting vote a person speaks of a MAJORITY if the

DOWNWARDS, and the like, may be used as the speaker or writer wishes.

CONTINUAL, CONTINUOUS

CONTINUAL and CONTINUOUS are not perfect synonyms. CONTINUAL always an unbroken succession, and CONTINUOUS suggests an unbroken or uninterrupted continuity.

CLIMACTIC, CLIMATIC

The adjective CLIMACTIC is formed from the noun, CLIMACTIC from CLIMATE.

AVENGE, REVENGE

If you AVENGE an injury, you do it in the interests of justice, but you REVENGE yourself for a personal injury—not in the interests of justice, but probably out of malice and a desire to "get even."

REBELLION, REVOLUTION

A REBELLION is an armed uprising against established authority. If the REBELLION has for its object the overthrow of government and succeeds in that object, it becomes a REVOLUTION.
