FOR BETTER ROADS.

Every citizen of Prince Edward Island should be interested in the coming campaign for better roads in this Province. Premier Borden has promised federal assistance in the good work for better roads in all the Provinces. Here, in Charlottetown the Central Farmer's Institute will hold a convention on Tuesday and Wednesday, November 22nd and 23rd, to initiate a strong movement forward and give some expert information on the advantages and construction of roads of the better class.

W. B. Mackenzie, Chief Engineer of the Government Railways, will deliver an address on the subject at this meeting and "Good Roads" Campbell, the Deputy Minister of Rail-

ways and Canals, will send a paper to be read. Prof. M. Cumming of the No. 4 Scotia College of Agriculture, Province. Premier Borden has promised federal assistance in the good work for better roads in all the Provinces. Here, in Charlottetown the Central Farmer's Institute will hold a convention on Tuesday and Wednesday, November 22nd and 23rd, to initiate a strong movement forward and give some expert information on the advantages and construction of roads of the better class.

When it is considered that it frequently costs the farmer more to move his produce two or three miles from his farm to the railway station than it costs to transport it fifty miles by rail, the vast importance of having the best country roads that are possible will become apparent at once. We hope that there may be a very large attendance at this important meeting.

PROPORTIONAL REPRESENTATION.

It is clearly arguable that any one qualified elector has quite as much right to be represented in Parliament as any other elector. But our representative system does not recognize that right. Take the last general election for the Dominion as an instance. There were 1,277,279 voters who cast their ballots in the election and these were pretty evenly divided between the two great parties. There were 616,948 of them who voted in support of the Laurier Government and 660,331 who voted in opposition to the Government. It so turned out that the 660,000 were able to elect 135 members while the 616,000 were only able to elect 86 members. It took the votes of 7,258 Liberal electors to elect one member while on the other side the votes of 4,890 Conser-

vative electors was sufficient to elect one member.

In the aggregate one Conservative vote was as effective as one and a half Liberal votes. Yet the system is not quite so unfair as the above statement would make it appear, because one party may profit by it at one election and the other party may profit by it at the next contest. As a matter of fact the Liberals had an even larger representation in proportion to their electoral strength in the last Parliament than the Conservatives now have.

The great fault of the existing system is that it is not fairly representative. The victorious party is always over-represented while the minority has always less than its due number of members. If at the present time the parties in Parliament were divided in proportion to their strength in the country Hon. Mr. Borden would have 116 members to support him in the House of Commons and Sir Wilfrid Laurier would have 105. The majority for the Borden Government would thus be only 11 instead of 50 as it is at present. In other words, the Government's majority in the House is four times as large as it would be if all the people were fairly represented.

It ought to be practicable to devise a plan that would give a fair representation to the minority in the House, but although the subject has received a good deal of attention at times no simple and entirely satisfactory plan has yet been evolved.

POLITICAL.

The Guardian understands from good authority that no course of action has yet been decided upon by the Provincial Government with regard to what shall be done or the advice which shall give to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor at the present time. It may be confidently expected, however, that as soon as the official declarations are made in the two recent bye-elections a decision will be reached and will be promptly made public. We learn also that a statement which appeared in The Patriot a few evenings ago, intimating that the Governor would be asked by the party now in office to grant a dissolution of the Legislature, was made without any official authority. The entire situation is being considered, but a definite decision will not be reached for a few days to come.

Friends of McGill University have started a whirlwind campaign to raise a million dollars as a further endowment for that noble institution and Dr. James Douglas, a former governor of the University, has offered \$100,000 as a beginning for the fund. In the past few days more than one half of the million has been subscribed.

THE PRICE OF POTATOES.

Mr. Editor—There appeared in The Guardian of the 14th a letter copied from a New Glasgow paper in which the writer made some bold assertions that we do not feel obliged to lie under—claiming that potatoes were only 35 cents on the Island and that the P. E. I. schooner men at the wharf, New Glasgow, were lower than the Chinese for dark and vain tricks in trying to make the people believe that the price on the Island was 40 cents.

Had we supposed this to have been written by a responsible party we would have replied to it before. If the writer had named the parties to whom he wrote for prices we would have taken more stock in his idle vapors. After writing to Summerside, Charlottetown and Georgetown for prices to suit him, he says: "What do the schooner men say to these absolute facts?" We have this to say that before beginning to load on October 20, hearing that potatoes could be bought for less than 40 cents at inland stations, we telephoned to James Kennedy of Kensington (a big shipper of produce) asking what his price was and his reply was 40 cents per bushel in bags at his station. They would cost about 46 cents shipped to some of the south side harbors.
