Island Gas Tax 35.37 Cents In Dollar

For a commodity which has become a necessity in so many lines of business activity, gasoline has been loaded with a crushing tax. In three provinces of the Dominion the tax content of every dollar's worth of gasoline purchased exceeds 30 cents a gallon and in all of them it is more than 25 cents. The figures for the various provinces are—British Columbia, 26.29 cents; Alberta, 25.04 cents; Saskatchewan, 25.17 cents; Manitoba, 25.26 cents; Ontario, 28.9 cents; Quebec, 27.44 cents; New Brunswick, 31.58 cents; Nova Scotia, 32.08 cents; Prince Edward Island, 35.37 cents. Over the Dominion at large, it means that for every dollar a consumer puts into gasoline, 27.83 cents goes in taxes. These figures do not indicate the complete tax content of a gallon of gasoline. They do indicate however, those which can be directly charged by the refiner and marketer against an already over-taxed necessity.
