CHEVALIER MARCONI.

One of the most noted men in the world today, and one toward whom the people of P. E. Island are looking with a personal interest since the disability of our telegraph connection, is Chevalier Marconi. He is yet marvellously young to have accomplished so much, being but twenty seven years of age. A brief sketch of his life and career may possibly serve as an incentive to some of the youthful readers of THE GUARDIAN to make the most of their opportunities for the good of themselves and of mankind.

Chevalier Marconi was born at Griffone near Bologna, Italy, 24th April 1874. He was educated at Leghorn and the University of Bologna, where he was graduated as an electrical engineer. He subsequently pursued his studies in England. His personal appearance is described as "slender, of an average height and though he is affable, he appears preoccupied. He has a long, well shaped head; fine bright hair, and thoughtful eyes. He is nervous and when he smiles, wrinkles collect around his mouth and eyes and disappear as quickly". He tells that from early life he has followed up scientific discoveries and was always on the track of anything new. He was not the original discoverer of the fact that electric signals could be sent through the air, but with painstaking industry and energy while still almost a boy he perfected the appliances without which that discovery would have been useless to the world. So long ago as 1893, when but 19 years of age he erected poles on his father's estate to conduct the experiments which have resulted in making him famous.

As Marconi himself says, to tell of his long and pains-taking experiments and to describe the appliances which he has perfected would fill a volume, and much of it would be unintelligible to the ordinary reader. Suffice it to say that he has created a system by which ship can talk with ship, or with a station on land, at a distance of tens and even hundreds of miles. In like manner messages can be transmitted on land across wide distances through the air without the aid of wires. But the system is yet only in its infancy and with possibilities before it which only the imagination can grasp. Marconi is at present in Newfoundland and he is coming to Halifax. Possibly he may yet visit the Island, or aid us without coming. He may yet so perfect his invention as to be able to send messages from Newfoundland to the British Isles, rendering ocean cables practically valueless. Who shall set a limit?

THE PUBLIC HEALTH.

Correspondents who write us representing various phases of public opinion as to what has been done and what ought to be done in regard to the preservation of the public health would do well to bear in mind a few well-known facts. Nearly all last winter smallpox was prevalent just across the Straits in New Brunswick, but the Island wholly escaped the infection. At the present time nearly every large Canadian city and many country districts are infected with the disease, while so far not only Charlottetown but the entire Province have escaped. Two cases have been brought to our shores in vessels, the first of these some weeks ago, and although the patient unfortunately died, no other cases resulted therefrom. The second case, a mild one is now isolated and cared for in the Marine Hospital at Keppoch and is progressing to recovery. There is, we think fair reason to hope that no other cases may develop as the result of this one.

Doubtless the management of these cases may have been open to criticism but much of the difficulty has necessarily arisen from a division of authority between the federal, provincial and local powers of the two Governments and the Board of Health. The aim and object of all good citizens ought to be, without re-

gard to politics or other considerations, to protect the public health, and to uphold the hands of all who are working to that end. The duty of the individual householder is to see that he and his family are protected by vaccination. This ought to be made compulsory. The clear duty of the Board of Health and City Council appears to be to make provision at once for an Epidemic Hospital. Such an institution is needed from year to year apart altogether from the present danger from smallpox. Should the latter disease visit us, as it has visited so many cities, we should be prepared to grapple with it, to save useful lives, and to stamp out the disease. At present we are painfully unprepared to do this.

THE GUARDIAN in common with a large circle of our citizens regrets the departure by the Princess this morning of Dr. and Mrs. Dickey who are hereafter to make their home in Halifax. During their brief residence in Charlottetown Dr. Dickey has become most favorably known as a clever specialist and is highly esteemed by his brethren of the medical profession, while both he and Mrs. Dickey have become favorites in social circles. We trust that in the larger field which Halifax affords Dr. Dickey may speedily find a rich reward for his skill and painstaking efforts.
