"Dynamo" Ramsay Is Genuine Value For His Nickname BY ALLAN NICKLESON Canadian Press Staff Writer LONDON, June 4.—(CP)—It was one of the quirks of this war that Admiral Sir Bertram Ramsay was on the retired list but all the time he was working flat out for the navy. That retirement business was straightened out only recently and now his greatest job lies ahead.

For him the Allied invasion is something in the nature of a return trip. It was he who brought the British troops home after the collapse of France. That's how he got his nickname, "Dynamo."

For that Ramsay was knighted. He has been "Dynamo" Ramsay ever since he served men and, as the master blue-printer of all major Allied amphibious operations of this war, he has been a man of many parts.

It goes back to the fact that about a month ago, Sir Bertram, a rear-admiral, figured his 40-year naval career was over and retired to his picturesque village of Goldstream in Berwickshire where Lady Ramsay resides. He had been chief of staff to the Commander-in-Chief Home Fleet, Sir Roger Backhouse, a seaman of the older school who delegated little authority to his subordinates.
