Air Squadron Formed

is First Created by National Guards of U. S.
 NEW YORK, Aug. 29. - New York state has the first air squadron to be organized by the national guard of the country.
 The 102nd, Observation Squadron of the New York National Guard Air Service, with headquarters at Mitchell Field, Long Island was inspected recently by state and federal officials.
 The personnel comprises veteran aviators, many of whom are aviators. It is expected that the Government will furnish the squadron with DeHavilland machines.
 Lieutenant Colonel Lawrence La Tourette Driggs who organized the squadron, has been attached to the staff of Major General Ryan, commanding the 27th Division. Major Kenneth P. Littauer, former commander of the 88th Squadron, is York's squadron commander.
 The roster includes Captains Curtis Wheeler, D. de Freest Larner, George A. Vaughn, Jr., Reginald L. Vandewater, and Henry B. Smith; Lieutenants Howard Burdick, Alexander McLanahan, Harold Buckley, Kenneth Noble and Portland Grosvenor. The enlisted personnel will be Company M, former infantry company, at Hempstead, Long Island.

Ulster Marking Time
 Delays Establishment of Government Departments
 BELFAST, Aug. 27. - Meetings of the Ulster Cabinet and of the Unionist members of the Northern Parliament were held at Belfast today to consider the political situation.
 Sir James Craig presided at a party meeting and outlined the action he had taken in regard to the Irish negotiations and his plans for the future. His statement met with the approval of the meeting. He indicated that owing to the protracted negotiations between the Imperial Government and Southern Ireland, the establishment of the departments of the Northern Government had been delayed. This, he said, would probably entail a further adjournment of Parliament to February next. If an adjournment is necessary, arrangements will be made to summon both Houses of Parliament in case of emergency.
