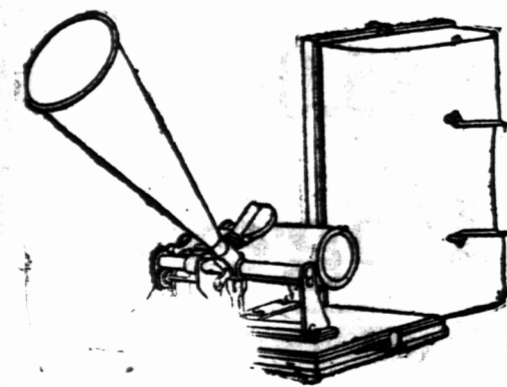

TAMPERING WITH THE WITNESSES

Disclosed by Evidence at Police Court.

Jobs are Promised and Free Trips to Boston Offered—The Case Against Gillis Dismissed By Magistrate.

Saturday was the regular Prohibition Day at the Police Court. There were a large number of spectators who listened with interest to the proceedings.

The first case was that of third offence against Peter Paul Gillis. This had been adjourned on several occasions in order to allow counsel, Welch and Wheat might produce a missing witness, Chappell for cross-examination. He was not forthcoming and the case was dismissed, somewhat to the surprise of those who have followed it through its various stages.

In the case against Elizabeth McMillan, Edmund Chandler swore the beer purchased by him was intoxicating. On the request of J J Johnston, counsel, case was adjourned till Tuesday.

George Offer was up for third offence and was represented by A J B Mellich. Several witnesses swore the beer was un-intoxicating and Edmund Chandler could not say, not having taken enough. Alex Spencer another witness left by the Princess. The case was dismissed.

Peter Benoit was called for second offence. He was represented by Mr. Mellich. Chandler was the principal witness. He had not taken enough of the beer to give an opinion. A young man named Bud, bartender with Benoit had been out to his father's place. He heard him say he would get a job on the Stanley if he (Chandler) left the Island for the present and if he got out he would see that the case against Mary Jane McMillan would be dismissed. Benoit's case was dismissed.

Mary Jane McMillan for second offence was next case called. A. J. B. Mellich was counsel. Chandler swore that he had been refused beer twice and another time got two glasses of intoxicating beer from Mrs. McMillan. The defendant went on the stand and swore positively that she sold no beer to witness. She never sold to those she did not know except strangers from abroad. Chandler, having left the court, was recalled and sent for by the Magistrate. He adhered to what he had previously stated. After deliberation the Magistrate adjourned the case till Tuesday in order that a man from St. Peter's who was with Chandler might if possible be procured. James Hennessey drunk and disorderly was given \$4 or 15 days.
