Germans claim Advance along 310-mile arc

Berlin, Oct. 10 (AP)—German troops, claimed by the High Command to be advancing everywhere along a 310-mile-wide "break-through" in the Russian lines, were reported tonight to stand within 100 miles of Moscow on the south and to be preparing to bypass the capital with the intention of surrounding it as Warsaw was strangled in 1939.

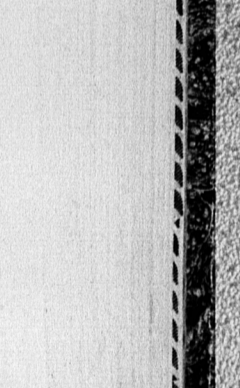
