Mr. Middleboro then went on to deal with the letting of contracts. For nine contracts covering half the there had been but five tenders he said, on one contract there had been but one tenderer and in the other eight contracts there were but two tenderers each. These big contracts were sublet to over 100 sub-contractors if the work had been divided into smaller lengths there would have been far more competition. He also pointed out that by delaying the beginning of work on a large contract in an inaccessible district the Davis firm had cleared \$740,000 without ever turning a shovel of earth. They had simply waited until other parts of railway came near

the North Grey members gave considerable attention to the question of over classification of road and loose rock as one of the channels where the money was wasted. On the mountain section there were 57 steel bridges, 209 wooden bridges and 1388 wooden culverts.

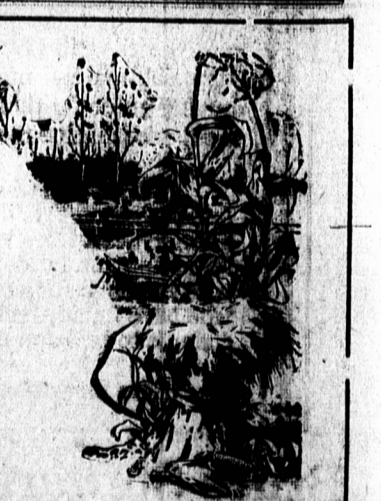
