Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family of any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must be a person of any Dominion Land Agency for the District. Entry by proxy is made in any Dominion Land Agency on Sub-Agency on certain conditions.
