The flight of three soldiers, one of them an American sergeant, the others British officers, from German-occupied Italy to escape across the Alps into Switzerland, provides the mounting momentum and excitement of "The Last Chance," much-discussed M-G-M International film which opened yesterday at the Capitol screen

Accompanying the soldiers on their harrowing trek over the ice-bound mountains are a heterogeneous group of internationalists who have been hounded from one country to another by the Germans; and, while the spectacular flight itself provides the story's suspense and dramatic impact, it is the heroism and iron-willed determination of these people to achieve their goal of a new freedom that gives the picture its stirring, unforgettable characteristics

The story opens when the American Sgt. Braddock, a typical G. I., and a fellow war prisoner, British Lt. Halliday, take advantage of an Allied bombardment to escape from the train which is transporting them to Germany
