### DUTIES OF OVERSEERS

Letter From J. H. Cumiskey, C. P. W.

### RESPECTING WINTER ROADS

What the Overseers Are Required By Law to Do.

Sir:—During the last few weeks I have noticed several locals in the different papers published in Charlottetown, respecting the willful neglect of certain Overseers notifying the inhabitants residing in their precinct, who are liable for the performance of labour on the winter roads.

I will now ask you to publish Section 21 of the Public Roads Act which is clearly defined the duties of the Overseers and penalties attached for the nonfulfillment of the same.

I should imagine Overseers willing to discharge their duties as such, and gladly, if solicited to the inhabitants residing in their precinct, divide the precinct into sections, which in many cases would allow persons to level ditches and break roads opposite their own property or a greater distance, without turning out all the inhabitants on one day, and taking them over the whole precinct which is generally about three miles, for the purpose of performing a very small amount of work.

I may also remind the Overseers of his Island who number about 100, that they are exempt from taxation on account of having to notify the inhabitants while at the same time if they did not occupy this position they would not be exempt from breaking the roads in winter. Hereafter if any person travelling on the roads and met with this willful neglect on the part of any Overseer, it is quite apparent that it is in his power to prosecute such Overseers under the provisions of the Public Roads Act of 1901, and amendments thereto.

24. The said Overseers shall have power and they are hereby required during the winter season, to summon as many of the inhabitants in the respective precincts within the age of eighteen and sixty, as they in their discretion shall think fit, to work at the times and places appointed on the highways and public winter roads, by breaking roads, or throwing up snow, or leveling ditches, or such winter roads or by opening water courses from those parts of roads where water is dammed or obstructed, and the said implements as the Overseer deems requisite, whenever the depth of snow or state of roads shall render the same necessary in each winter or spring, and at no greater distance than three miles from their own houses; provided that the said persons shall be called out in such a way as to render as nearly equal as possible the labor performed by all and each; and every person neglecting or refusing to turn out with his horse or team of horses, or with such implements as may be directed by the Overseer of the precinct, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two dollars for every such neglect or refusal; and the said for the recovery of the said fine shall be brought in the name of the said Overseer, and the Overseer of the precinct is authorized to notify the inhabitants of their precinct when they are required to turn out for the purpose of breaking the winter roads or leveling ditches, or by opening water-courses from those parts of roads where water is dammed or obstructed therein, as aforesaid. Any Overseer of highways who neglects to perform the duties required to be performed under this section shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five dollars.

(a) Provided that the said Overseers shall have power and they are hereby required during the winter season to summon horses and teams from inhabitants over the ages of sixty years, in their respective precincts for the breaking of roads as provided by the said Act, and such inhabitants shall be liable for neglect or refusal to comply with such summons in the same manner and to the same extent as inhabitants between the ages of eighteen and sixty years are under the provisions of this Act.

### MAN MURDERED FOR ACT OF MERCY

Stabbed by desperadoes While Saving an Aged Man from Mob Violence.

PARRY SOUND, Ont., Jan. 3.—A sleigh load of men, several of them being Italians, while returning from Whiteside to their lodging at Grant's Construction Camp, on the Canadian Northern Railway on Christmas night, halted at the McCormick homestead and demanded admission. When the old farmer refused to open his door the men broke into the house and started to beat McCormick.

News of the attack on the house had reached the camp, and Dan McDodd, a nephew of Grant, the contractor, ran over to McCormick's and several other men with him. Directly McDodd set foot in the house, an Italian plunged a knife in his heart and he died almost instantly. Three others who were attempting to drive out the intruders were stabbed, one of them very seriously. The Italians got away, but constables are scouring the country for them.
