Stock Prices Move Lower In New York

NEW YORK, July 26—The stock market faltered today and leading issues dropped fractions to more than 2 points, however, a number of favored specialties contested the trend with substantial advances.

Doubts concerning the action of U. S. Steel directors, meeting after the close on the preferred dividend were eventually answered by the board's vote to pay the regular quarterly disbursement of \$1.75 to the senior issue despite a deficit in the June quarter of more than \$5,000,000, the largest for this period since 1933.

While U. S. Steel Common finished off 1-4 points at 61, the preferred stock ended with a net advance of a point at 103.

Declines overlapped gains on a fairly sluggish Canadian list. International Nickel dropped more than a point to 30 3/4 with Districts, Lake Shore Mines, Imperial Oil and Ford dipping fractions. Dome Mines, Dominion Stores, McIntyre and Industrial Alcohol improved fractions.

The Associated Press average of 60 issues was off 5 of a point at 50.3 with the industrial and rail composites showing the widest declines. The utility average was down a shade.

Conspicuous share losers included Bethlehem, Montgomery Ward, Sears Roebuck, Goodyear, J. I. Case, Anacostia, General Electric, Du Pont, Westinghouse, General Electric, and Allied Chemical. Philip Morris was an isolated upward jumper, holding an advance of 4 5/8 at 125 1/2.

American Telephone came to life and stepped up about 3 points at the best, but slipped at the last and closed ahead 1 3/8 at 143 1-8.

Light Selling On Montreal Stock Market

MONTREAL, July 26—(CP)—Light selling in the first hour set the stock exchange off to a bad start from which it failed to recover.

Losses were well scattered. St. Lawrence paper preferred dropped 1-4 points to 25 1/2. St. Lawrence Corporation preferred about a point each and the remainder of the group 1-4.

Nickel dipped in active trading, losing a point with smelters a shade lower. Noranda was one of the few gainers, firming 1-4. In the aviation equipment, National Steel Car led the way in a 4 point slide. Canadian Car issues edged from 1 1/2 to 1 1/4.

Utilities were quiet. Power Corporation and Gatineau recorded small losses but Montreal Power retained the weakness with a 3-8 point improvement. Elsewhere, National Breweries jumped 3-4 to set up a new high for the year of 42-1/2.

Fur Market

REPORT OF SILVER FOX SALE HELD JULY 14TH & 15TH, 1938

A large percentage of the entire offering was taken by domestic fur merchants, manufacturers and retailers. The interest however, centered principally around the full silver types with the better quality skins bringing comparatively stronger prices than the pelts of mediocre quality.

It was definitely demonstrated that in spite of the occasional rumors to the contrary, full silvers will continue to command greater interest from the trade generally, than the darker types. It was also apparent that the trade was keenly interested in the finest quality pelts which would indicate the continued popularity of Silver Foxes among the discriminating consumers.

Produce Prices

MONTREAL, July 26—(CP)—Demand for high-grade eggs continued strong today on open produce markets, prices rising about a half cent. Heavier trading reduced the spread in butter and cheese selling price, both tending to drift lower.

Creamery butter prints to retail dealers sold for 26 1-4-1-2 cents a pound and solids for 25 3-4-26. Western butter delivered here was offered at 25 1-2 cents. Que. No. 1 pasteurized whole milk jobbing price was 24 3-4-7-8 cts. Cheese sold at 14 1-8 cents a pound wholesale for No. 1 Ontario white, 14 1-4 for Ontario colored, 13 5-8 for Quebec white and 13 3-4 for Quebec colored.

Graded egg shipments in cartons or less were offered at 28 1-2-29 cents a dozen for A-large, 27-27 1-2 for A-medium, 24 1-2-2 1/2 for B and 22 for C.

Potatoes: Quebec new No. 180's 89-85, Que. new No. 2 80's 65-70.

NEW YORK, July 26—(AP)—A minor recovery movement in terms of the United States dollar was shown by leading European currencies in quiet foreign exchange dealings today.

Sterling closed up 3-8 of a cent at 44.32 5-8 and the French franc up 10 1-8 of a cent to 2.76 1-2, both a trifle under the day's highs. The Canadian dollar was 1-32 of a cent down at 99 23-32.
