FORTY PERSONS WERE ENTOMBED

By Falling Building In Oxford Twenty of Whom Escaped Uninjured

LONDON, April 6—(Special)—Two old tenement houses in Castle Street Oxford, collapsed early this morning and forty people, mostly Germans, are buried in the debris.

TENEMENT FIRE COST ONE LIFE

NEW YORK, April 6—(Special)—One woman lost her life, nearly score of men and women were injured and as many more were rescued today during a fire which destroyed a four-storey tenement house in Pearle Street.

INTERCOLONIAL OR INTER PROVINCIAL

Hughes Moves And Martin Sees To Change Name Of Government Railway And Government Operate Ferry Service Across Straits

OTTAWA, April 6—(Special)—The Commons today had a discussion on the appropriateness of the names which the Government railways bear.

Mr. Hughes declared that as the names Intercolonial Railway and P. E. Island Railway should be dropped and the name Interprovincial be substituted therefore.

Mr. Martin supported the motion and was emphatic in regard to discrimination in rates to which Mr. Hughes had referred.

WILL DELAY LAND PURCHASE A DECADE

LONDON, April 4—The prolonged depression in the money market which has made it impossible for the government to raise further large loans, required to fulfill the intentions of the Irish land purchase act of 1903, resulted in the appointment of a committee of the treasury which has just reported in favor of several financial expedients to tide over the difficulty.

STOLEN SOUVENIR RESTORED CHINA

Marriage Contract of Reigning Emperor Taken in Loot of Troops.

BERLIN, April 4—One of China's most sacred public documents, the marriage contract of the reigning Emperor Kwang-hue, dated February 25, 1899, has been discovered in Germany and formally handed over to the Chinese Government.

RUSSIA'S SCHEME IS APPROVED

By Austria And Germany—Britain Still Holds Out For Reform

ST. PETERSBURG, April 4—The Russian proposal for the settlement of the Macedonian question which aimed at giving to the international financial commission control over the police and courts of Macedonia, has received Austro-German approval as to its general lines, although the advisability of requiring the commissioners to enter the Turkish State service and the formation of a local militia from the peasantry to preserve order, as well as other minor points is questioned.
