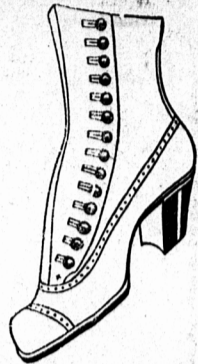

...THE PERU Medicine Company, arrived from the Magdalen Islands on the Lady Sybil Saturday. They proceeded at once to Elmira.

...TELEPHONE REPAIRS.—The old decayed telephone poles between Rollo Bay and Dundas, are being removed and larger and better are being substituted.

...THE HATTIE C.—St John N. B., is anchored at the railway wharf. She finished discharging her cargo on Saturday, which consisted of a deck load of hemlock timber for Souris Breakwater.

...RIPENING CROPS.—A visitor from Dundas reports that the grain, especially barley, is ripening very fast, the weather being favorable for this purpose. Several fields have already been cut. He also says that turnips appear to be an excellent crop.

...LIFE SAVING STATION.—Messrs Alfred Paquet and Ronald McIsaac at present engaged in removing the Life Saving Station from the right side of the break water to a more favorable position between the railway and Matthew & McLean's wharves. The great difficulty, which was formerly experienced in launching a Life Boat at low tide, will, to a great extent, be overcome, and in future it can be launched with less labor and more swiftness.

...CARRS OF STONE.—The Miriam G. Wallace, N. S., has discharged her cargo of stone and on Saturday afternoon was laying in Souris Harbor waiting for the heavy gale to abate. She will set sail at the earliest opportunity. This stone has been placed along the outside of the breakwater and is for the purpose of shielding the work from the heavy seas that would otherwise beat against it.

...UP-TO-DATE.—Many of the progressive merchants and citizens of Souris have, of late taken a pride in painting up and repairing their stores and dwelling houses. On Main Street great improvements have been made. J. J. Hughes & Co., Matthew & McLean Co., Augustus McDonald and C. C. Carlton have painted their stores, while many private residences have also been painted in bright and attractive colors and their beauty is a subject of comment especially to visitors.

...PLEASANT AFFAIR.—A very successful pie-social and dance was held in New Zealand school on Friday, August 29th. As a large crowd had assembled, dancing began about eight o'clock and continued to eleven when the pies were ably auctioned off by Mr. Dalls Paquet, Souris. Dancing was then resumed and, as the young people became more and more exhilarated, the glowing hours were chased with flying feet until a r. streak on the eastern horizon heralded the approach of morning.

...NEW BUILDING.—Mr. J. J. Hughes & Co., are busily engaged in building a large warehouse. This building will have a concrete foundation, measuring 114 feet in length and 60 feet in breadth. The cellar will be seven feet deep and will be so arranged that carts can drive in and out without difficulty. The work of excavation and laying the foundation is in charge of Mr. Louis Deagle, Rollo Bay, who has proved himself to be a competent foreman. The work of excavating being now practically completed, the construction work will begin at once, as it is intended to have the building ready for use the coming Autumn.

She first anchored off the railway wharf, where she unloaded a deck load of creosote piles for Souris Breakwater. This part of her cargo weighed in the vicinity of 200 tons and has been shipped from Jacksonville, Fla. On Saturday morning she moved to Matthew & McLean's wharf where she will discharge 290 tons of hard coal shipped from Elizabeth Port, N. J.

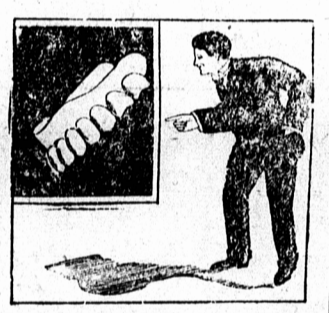

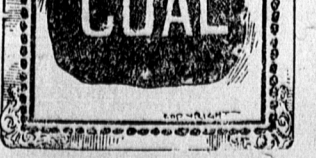

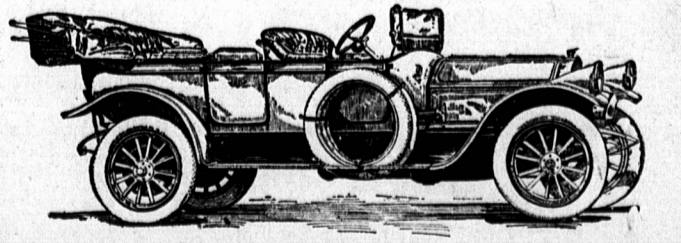
