Second Annual Track And Field Championships

Ten events, five track and five field, will be on the programme, which will get under way at 2.30 o'clock in the afternoon. For these sports the cream of lady athletes in the Maritimes will be entered.

There will be no entry fee, and no charge at the gate the day of the sports. Gold medals will be awarded to all winners, with silver medals for second places. A trophy will be awarded the athlete scoring the highest number of points in the meet. Points will be awarded as follows: First, 5 points; second, 3 points and third, 1 point.

TWEDDELL WINS BRITISH GOLF AMATEUR CROWN

HOYLAKE, June 4.—Dr. William Tweddell of Stourbridge today became the amateur champion golfer of Great Britain by defeating D. E. Landale, of the Royal Liverpool Club 7 and 6, in the 36-hole final here.

Jesse Sweetser, the American who won the title in 1925, did not defend the title this year.

HOYLAKE, May 28.—Dr. Tweddell, who succeeds to the British amateur golf title, which Jesse Sweetser won last year but did not defend, is 30 years old. He learned most of his golf in Scotland. Although never before achieving outstanding prominence among their amateurs, he twice previously reached the last 16 survivors in amateur championships. He has won considerable reputation in the north of England and won the Cruden Bay tournament in 1919.

He is a long driver, but is particularly distinguished by his extreme deliberation. He is spoken of as "the golfer who never has been known to hurry".
