Also estimated earnings General Refractories for the September quarter were nearly equivalent to the two previous quarters of \$1.20. General Cigars is scheduled to have a dividend meet-

ing today. We would look for a firm and active opening today and believe the market will do better. All classes of stocks will probably participate, and specific stocks which look higher are Steel, Bethlehem steel, General Motors, Chrysler, Montgomery Ward, Sears Roebuck, Anaconda, Kennecott, Penn. R. R. and White Motors.

MINING

TORONTO, Oct. 5—(CP)—The Toronto Mining share section lost ground in active trading today despite a flurry of strength in a group of the golds. Heavy action was left to a few of the penny shares, and all recorded wide gains. In the big golds, McIntyre was weakest, losing a point while Wright Hargreaves and Teck Hughes edged 5 each and Lake Shore edged 1-4. Hard Rock pulled along 15 to 2.70 while Buffalo-Ankerite firmed 10, Little Long Lac 30, O'Brien 30, Pioneer 20 and Toburn 10. Off-setting these gains were losses of 5 to 10 for Central Patricia, Francoeur, Anglo-Huronian, Kirkland-Hudson Bay, Pamour, Read-Author and Siscoe. Roche was taken in heavy volume in the last hour to show a net gain of 10 cents at 32. Moneta advanced 11 cents, Lebel 3 1-8. Ymir-spiers 4, St. Anthony 1 1-2, Ymir 2 and Lake Maron 3-4. The big copper stocks, Noranda and Hudson Bay, weakened fractions each. Silver shares were mildly weak.
