(Continued from the First Page.) After a visit to the Indian camps where the ladies were much interested in aboriginal modes of living and the younger members of the party found amusement studying the papooses.

At the Old Fort Mr. John Newson recalled in a very interesting manner the incidents which made the spot historic. The days of French occupation there and in other parts of the Island was recalled.

Returning toward the Newson farm house the remains of the old paved road of the early days of British occupation were recalled to notice, and the cellar of the old government house was visited.

In the afternoon an excursion was made to Holland's Cove and here Hon. Mr. Brecken, with acknowledgement to Mr. Henry Cundall for much of his information, read a most interesting and instructive account of Major Holland's work in P.E. Island.

The day was delightfully cool and pleasant, the fields and grove were in their best attire and all influences combined to make the occasion one of rare and delightful enjoyment.

Instructional Camp at Brighton.

The following are the battalion orders issued for the camp of instruction at Brighton:

BATTALION ORDER. Headquarters 82nd Battalion, Charlottetown, 31st June, 1899. In accordance with District Order dated 20th June inst. and referring to Battalion orders dated June 5th and June 13th respectively the annual training therein referred to will be in a brigade camp and not in a regimental camp as therein ordered.

The troops composing the camp will be 4th Reg. C. A. Nos. 3, 4 & 5 Companies 82nd Battalion. The Companies of the 82nd Battalion will proceed from their Company headquarters as follows:—

Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4 & 6 Companies will march and arrive in camp not later than 12 o'clock, noon, (local).

No 5 by rail from Hunter River at 9.40 a. m. local. No. 7 by rail from Alberton at 6.40 a. m. local.

No 8 by rail from Cape Traverse at 6.00 a. m. local. Officers commanding companies proceeding by rail will exchange transportation for railway tickets before boarding the train.

An allowance of twenty-five cents per diem for each officer, non-com. officer and man actually present in camp will be paid in lieu of rations.

One Surgeon only from each unit will attend camp. R. O. 1898 P. r. 6.6
