and Anderson said many kind and appreciative things, and certainly this needs to be recorded about the meeting that the public work of a courageous pastor, as well as his private influence over individual men, was spoken of most delicately, yet with deep feeling.

The choir rendered some very appropriate selections, the ladies ever mindful of Martha's care, provided supper in the vestry, and an enjoyable (even though sad in some respects) meeting was closed with the Benediction by Rev. E. J. Rattae.

The above brief account of what was really a demonstration, is sent by request of many representative men of Kensington and vicinity. The addresses follow:—

To Rev. A. D. Stirling:—

We meet this evening to express our high appreciation of your services during the past six years that you have been our pastor. As we look back over these years we recall many happy memories of a life filled with faithful service for the Master, ever looking to the welfare of your people without regard to personal comfort, a ministry truly useful; you have ever been among us as he that serveth.
