Columbus in wax is shown sitting at a table with his chief officer standing before him. The furniture in the cabin is all of the fifteenth century period. The figures of the prisoners in chains and the one inmate of the cramped hospital are very realistic and the costumes are true to the period. The original compass of Columbus, the dial for telling the time of day, the ancient bow guns and spears, and other relics not heretofore shown here, form an exhibit well worth seeing. The Boy Scouts were on hand on Saturday and will be on deck again today to assist. The proceeds as before stated, are in aid of the British Sailors' Relief Fund.

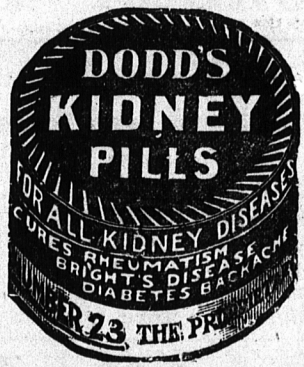
