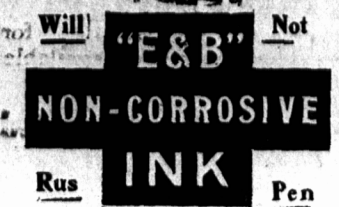

**PANIC IN STORE  
AS BULLETS FLY**

CHICAGO, Ill., May 21 (Special).—One man was shot and crowds of women shoppers became in a panic stricken in a department store when a private detective saw a negro snatch a woman's handbag and fired three bullets at him.  
One bullet pierced the right ear of Alvin Bisswanger, manager of the jewelry department, and grazed his head, another narrowly missed the head of a young saleswoman and the third entered the wall. The negro was captured after a hard fight with the store detective and two policemen.  
The shooting occurred on the main floor of the store when scores of persons were at the counters.

DELHI, Ont., May 19.—Word reached here this afternoon of the sudden death of Rev. John Johnston, pastor of the Presbyterian church at Lyndoch. It appears that Rev. Mr. Johnston was making some repairs to the roof of the barn and had accidentally fallen to the ground, causing instant death.
