MR. O'CONNOR MET SPEAKER CANNON

WASHINGTON, D. C. December 15.—T. P. O'Connor Irish member of the British House of Commons, was presented to Speaker Cannon by Thomas F. Walsh at the close of yesterday's session of the House. The Speaker was in a jovial frame of mind and the two conversed for some time. Both on the floor of the Chamber and in the Speaker's office, Mr. O'Connor was the centre of attraction in impromptu receptions.

On leaving the Speaker, "Tay Pay" declared that he had the highest hopes of Irish home rule as a result of the popular vote on budget in England.

"When the election has been won by the Liberal party, and I have no idea the result will be otherwise," he went on, "the leaders will refuse to take office in the Government unless the power of the House of Lords is made merely suspensory. Any measure vetoed by the House of Commons, where it will be considered with the recommendations of the Upper House, and acted upon as the Commons sees fit. If the peers do not agree to this curtailment of the veto the nomination of enough new peers to obtain a majority in that chamber will be made."

Mr. O'Connor will sail for England next week, where he says he will take an active part in the election campaign.

Elizabeth, N. J., Dec 16.—Joseph and George Adams, small brothers, found dead on the railroad track, ten and fourteen years of age were shocked to death by a wire which had fallen.

They were grasped in each others arms, indicating that one of the little victims had stepped on the wire first and the other met death trying to drag his brother to safety.

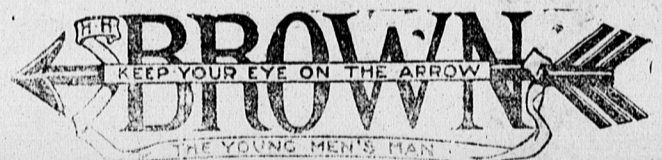
