### COUNTRY SISTER VIEW

Sir,—In your issue of Aug. 1st we read a letter of complaint from a city lady signing herself Fair Play. We fully expected to see a reply thereto, but as none has been forthcoming we will in some small way endeavor to meet the arguments set forth. In the first place why is it that the girls who attend the P. W. C. are mostly country girls? Would it not seem a much easier thing for city parents who can keep their daughters in their homes, to give them a college course, than for those who must send them to town and pay their board while there?

Perchance the difficulty lies with the daughters, it may be that they prefer strolling the street, attending picture shows, etc., to the somewhat dull occupation of study, and in this putting pleasure before duty, and an earnest endeavor toward self-improvement. It is just possible that she is following the example of her mother, who, so "Fair Play" tells us—prefers to feed her family on canned stuffs, to the tune of "An enormous number of operations for appendicitis, etc." rather than stay off the streets part of the time at least, and properly cook suitable food for her family. After all can we blame the daughter too much?

Again are there not dress-makers on almost every block who would instruct the city daughter if she cared to be instructed? As to whether or not the country appreciates the privileges of the Short Course, is shown in the fact that there are always more applicants than can be accommodated. If "Fair Play" would only consider all the advantages the city girl has over her country sister, such as graded schools, P. W. C. at her door, this we understand she does not appreciate. Professors in almost any line she might wish to take up, right at hand, etc., we do not doubt but she would feel somewhat ashamed of her outburst over the fact of the country girls and women having the advantage of a fortnight's instruction in Household Science. I fully agree that Household Science should be on the curriculum of the public schools, and if the mothers of the town would work with, rather than against the country mothers, much could be done toward that end.

### Meeting Of The P.E.I. Cheese Board

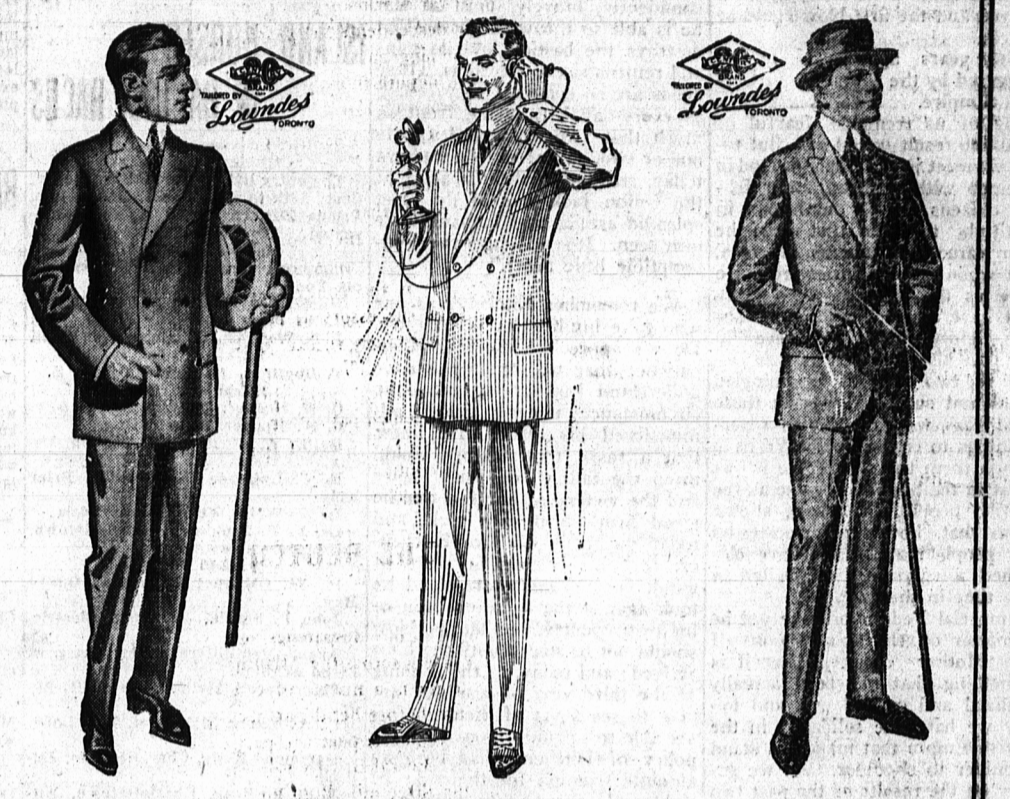
