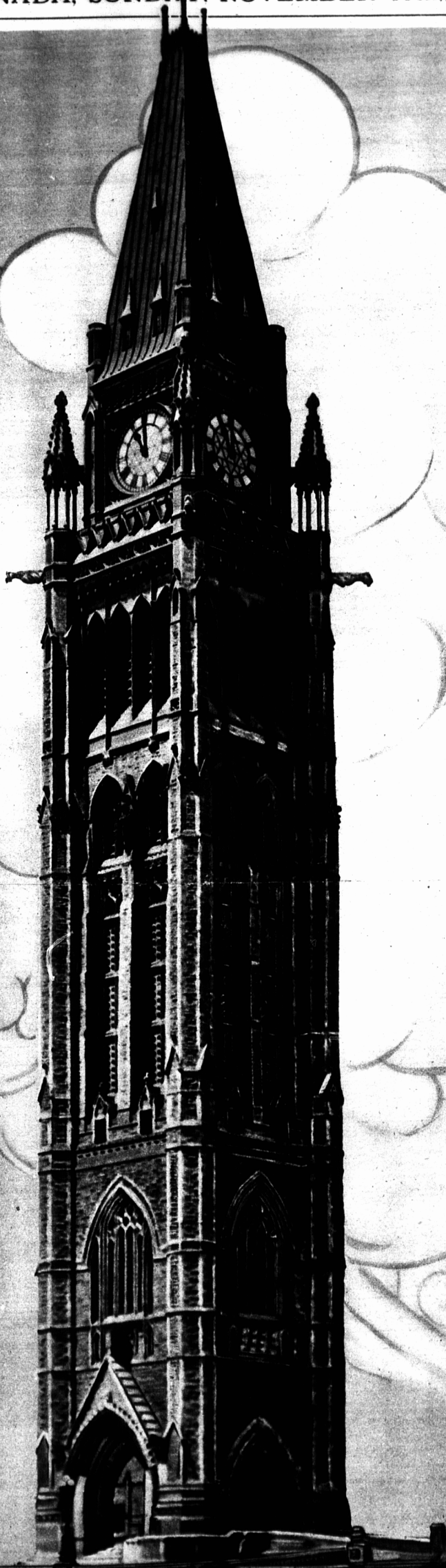

**MEMORIAL CHAMBER**  
The Walls of the Memorial Chamber are faced with Chateaux Giffard  
Marble, a gift from France, and its floor is paved with stones from  
Belgium. The Altar of Sacrifice is a block of English Marble,  
and will be the resting place for Canada's Book of Remembrance, in  
which the names of more than sixty thousand citizens who died in  
the Great War, are to be inscribed.



## THE VICTORY MEMORIAL TOWER

It is two hundred and fifty feet high. — Its clock is sixteen feet in diameter. — It houses a carillon of fifty bells.  
Its archway forms the main entrance to the Dominion's House of Parliament.
