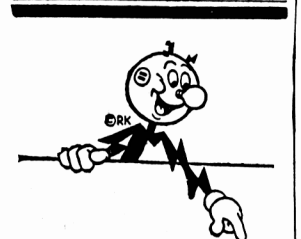

#### HISTORIC LOG HOUSE

EDMONTON (CP) — A two-story chinked log house in south Vancouver has just been named one of 18 official city historic sites. Built in 1875 by John Walters, pioneer lumber mill operator, the house was the first in the district and was a refuge for settlers fleeing during the Northwest Rebellion.

#### New Minister Comes To Trinity Church



Reverend H. E. D. Ashford, M.B.E., B.A., B.D., comes this week to take up his duties as minister of Trinity United Church, Charlottetown. Mr. Ashford was born in Newcastle, New Brunswick, receiving his early education at Mount Allison and going on to Queen's University and Union College. As a student he took an active part in athletics, was president of the student body and was one of the originators of the Student Christian Movement. He won the Chown Gold medal in history.

After graduation Mr. Ashford went to British Columbia, where he held two pastorates. There too he was very active in athletics and organizing athletics for young people. He played and refereed hockey all over southern British Columbia.

Mr. Ashford then went to India as a missionary. Between terms in India he was minister of St. Paul's United Church, Brandon, one of the largest churches in Manitoba. After a varied career in India, he returned to Canada in 1939 and went into the R.C.A.F. He served as chaplain in Canada, England, Africa and the continent, going to Africa shortly after "D" Day. He was known as the "Flying Padre," being the only chaplain to fly on active operations against the enemy. He was also the only Canadian Air Force chaplain to be decorated before the end of hostilities, and he served on more "fronts" than any other chaplain. Since his discharge from the R.C.A.F., he and Mrs. Ashford have made their home in Calgary, as he has been Field Secretary for Western Canada for the Missionary and Maintenance Department of the United Church of Canada. Mrs. Ashford was the former Miss Evelyn Jackson of Vancouver. They have three sons: Ray and Ian are student missionaries of the United Church of Canada in Saskatchewan, and Glenn is coming this week with his parents for summer holidays before entering Queen's University.
