WHAT MAY HAPPEN

LONDON, Aug. 18.—"By E. Asplemead Bartlett" special war correspondent of the London Daily Telegraph "we have not entered this war merely to hold back a German invasion of Belgium or France, we entered it to obtain lasting peace which will remove forever from our shores and from the frontiers of our allies the constant dread of sudden invasion and which will enable us to curtail the immense sums of money we are yearly obliged to spend on military account, expenditures which in future, according to the opinion of practically all leading economists would reduce all the nations of Europe to a state bordering on bankruptcy. To obtain this result the military autocrat of Germany must be crushed once for all. We have no wish to injure the German people. We have no wish to upset the equitable balance of power in Europe. There can be no compromise to bring such a peace. Supposing a great battle is fought on only the line of French and German frontier in which the allies are uniformly successful, that is to say, the German army is worsted to such an extent that it cannot again take the offensive, it would relieve the minds of 40 million French people from the constant dread which has been hanging over them for the last forty years, but would not secure lasting peace. Supposing after such a battle Kaiser Wilhelm's advisors, seeing the game

of aggression has shot its bolt, should endeavor to come to immediate terms, what are the conditions of peace which we must ask? France must have the line of the Rhine as her new frontier. She will take nothing else as the return for the sacrifices of the past forty years. Belgium must have rectified the violence of her frontier and also compensation for the immense damage inflicted on her. Presuming that, England, if we cannot destroy it by fighting, must insist upon a war indemnity and at the other end of Europe Russia will also demand territory and guarantees for the future. These must be the minimum terms for the allies. They may seem severe but they are essential to the maintenance of peace in the future. flight.
