

—The latest news, first of all.

—The mercury registered five below zero at Summerside yesterday morning.

—A. C. Rogers, Summerside, left yesterday morning on a business trip to the Eastern part of the Island.

—Dr. Stanbury of Toronto and A. W. P. Gourlie, Summerside, were passengers to Charlottetown by the morning train yesterday.

—Last week's Wesleyan contains a lengthy notice on the death of the late Mrs. Colin Wright of Belesque, written by Rev. Geo. Steel.

—The new boxes at the Post Office at Summerside, were placed in position yesterday, and the Post Master would like all box holders to kindly call and exchange their keys, but not to do so while a mail is being opened.

—The death took place at his home in Newton on Saturday morning last of James McKenna, one of the most respected residents of that place. Mr. McKenna was taken suddenly ill on Wednesday last. On Friday morning an operation, for an obstruction of the bowels was successfully performed by Drs. Jenkins of Charlottetown, McGowan and McMillan of Kinkora. Good hopes were entertained for his recovery after the operation, but the heart was not able to stand the strain and death took place from heart trouble. Deceased was sixty two years of age and leaves beside a sorrowing widow a large family of sons and daughters, numbering fourteen in all. Five of the sons are at present absent from the Province.

—The death occurred at his home, in Glenarry, Lot 7, on Friday morning last of Peter Butler, deceased, it will be remembered, was supposed to have been the person who caused the slight fire in the rear part of Ludlow Hall, Summerside, about a month ago, in which he was badly burned about the legs and lower part of the body. These burns did not appear to be very serious at the time, but later on they seemed to be getting worse instead of better, and on operation was performed some days ago by Drs. Murphy of Timiskaming, McGrath of Bloomfield and McDougall of O'Leary. But the unfortunate man was not strong enough to stand the effects of the operation and died on Friday morning last. Deceased was a son of the late Lawrence Butler of Glenarry, Lot 7, and leaves to mourn besides a sorrowing mother, one brother and four sisters. The funeral took place on Sunday last and was very largely attended.

LIGHTED KEG OF POWDER JUST TO SEE IT BLAZE

JOHNSTOWN, Pa., Jan. 24—Three children between three and four years old were killed, another aged five was severely injured and two women, mothers of the little ones, were painfully injured recently at Stoughton, Somerset County, when the children touched a match to a keg of powder to see it blaze. All the dead and injured are foreigners. Their home was almost demolished.
