Record of Performance News
C. E. MacKenzie

The Record of Performance is the yearly milk and butter fat record of recognized pure bred cows, conducted by the Dominion Department of Agriculture. The different dairy breeds have their standards set by the breeders associations of the different breeds, are as follows: Ayrshire 2 year olds have to produce 5500 lbs milk and 198 lbs. fat in the year. Three year olds, 6500 lbs. milk and 234 lbs. fat. Four year olds 7500 lbs. milk and 270 lbs. fat and mature cows 8500 lbs. milk and 306 lbs. fat.

Brown Swiss...
Two Year Olds—4,000 lbs. milk and 148 lbs. fat.
Three Year Olds—5,000 lbs. milk and 185 lbs. fat.
Four Year Olds—6,000 lbs. milk and 222 lbs. fat.
Mature Cows—7,000 lbs. milk and 259 lbs. fat.

French Canadian.
Two Year Olds—4,400 lbs. milk and 198 lbs. fat.
Three Year Olds—5,200 lbs. milk and 234 lbs. fat.
Four Year Olds—6,000 lbs. milk and 270 lbs. fat.
Mature Class—6,800 lbs. milk and 306 lbs. fat.

Guernsey.
Two Year Olds—5,000 lbs. milk and 200 lbs. fat.
Three Year Olds—6,000 lbs. milk and 240 lbs. fat.
Four Year Olds—7,000 lbs. milk and 280 lbs. fat.
Mature Class—8,000 lbs. milk and 320 lbs. fat.

Holstein.
Two Year Olds—9,000 lbs. milk and 306 lbs. fat.
Three Year Olds—10,000 lbs. milk and 340 lbs. fat.
Four Year Olds—11,000 lbs. milk and 374 lbs. fat.
Mature Class—12,000 lbs. milk and 408 lbs. fat.

Jersey.
Two Year Olds—5,500 lbs. milk and 275 lbs. fat.
Three Year Olds—6,000 lbs. milk and 300 lbs. fat.
Four Year Olds—7,000 lbs. milk and 350 lbs. fat.
Mature Class—8,000 lbs. milk and 400 lbs. fat.

Shorthorn.
Two Year Olds—4,000 lbs. milk and 140 lbs. fat.
Three Year Olds—4,500 lbs. milk and 157 lbs. fat.
Four Year Olds—5,000 lbs. milk and 175 lbs. fat.
Mature Class—5,500 lbs. milk and 192 lbs. fat.

Thus from a glance at the above requirements, the standards range as follows:
1st—Holstein; 2nd—Jersey; 3rd—Guernsey; 4th—Ayrshire and French Canadian, equal; 5th—Brown Swiss and 6th Shorthorn.

For a cow to qualify in each of the above classes, besides producing the required amount of milk and fat, she has to freshen again within fifteen months from the commencement of her test.

Throughout Canada for the year ending March 31st, 1919, the number of cows qualifying were as follows:
Ayrshire 190; Brown Swiss NONE; French Canadian 3; Guernseys 3; Holstein 165; Jerseys 74 and Shorthorn 42, making a total of 477 cows qualifying, the outstanding breeds being the Ayrshire and Holsteins with the Jersey's making a very creditable showing.

If we take the corresponding classes of each breed we find that in the mature classes the standing is on a fat basis.
1st, Holstein with 25,085 lbs. milk and 897 lbs. fat.
2nd, Jersey with 14,815 lbs. milk and 739 lbs. fat.
3rd, Ayrshire with 16,081 lbs. milk and 659 lbs. fat.
4th, Shorthorn with 11,862 lbs. milk and 513 lbs. fat.
5th, Guernseys with 7374 lbs. milk and 359 lbs. fat.
6th, French Canadian with 4632 lbs. milk and 247 lbs. fat.

1st—Holstein, 18,864 lbs. milk and 622 lbs. fat.
2nd—Jersey's, 11,290 lbs. milk and 621 lbs. fat.
3rd—Ayrshire, 13,288 lbs. milk and 533 lbs. fat.
4th—Shorthorn, 10,463 lbs. milk and 390 lbs. fat.

Three Year Olds.
1st—Jersey with 11,136 lbs. milk and 700 lbs. fat.
2nd—Holstein with 15,063 lbs. milk and 599 lbs. fat.
3rd—Ayrshire with 11,209 lbs. milk and 500 lbs. fat.
4th—Guernseys with 7374 lbs. milk and 359 lbs. fat.
5th—Shorthorn with 5,218 lbs. milk and 260 lbs. fat.

Two Year Olds.
1st—Jerseys with 9,447 lbs. milk and 573 lbs. fat.
2nd—Holstein with 16,192 lbs. milk and 545 lbs. fat.
3rd—Ayrshire with 10,933 lbs. milk and 499 lbs. fat.
4th—Shorthorn with 10,230 lbs. milk and 448 lbs. fat.
5th—Guernseys with 7,007 lbs. milk and 341 lbs. fat.
6th—French Canadian with 4632 lbs. milk and 247 lbs. fat.

Thus we see that Holstein and Jersey's have tied for first place with the Ayrshire, Shorthorn, Guernsey, etc. coming in rotation.

Now, let us see how P. E. Island breeders stand. In the Ayrshire, Mature Class, two cows qualify, with "White Rose" owned by S. R. Cairns, Free-town, standing 5th in a class of 48, with a production of 12,569 lbs. milk and 522 pounds fat. In the Three Year Old class, "Lone Pine Belle" owned by Edwin Reid, Robt. Bay, stands second with 9,922 pounds milk and 408 pounds fat in a class of 22.

While "Brightside Bossy" owned by B. R. Brown, York, stands thirteenth with 7,251 pounds milk and 344 pounds fat in the two year old class.

In the Holstein Mature Class "Victoria May Eranch" owned by W. J. Gibson and Son, Marshfield, stands in twelfth place with 14,013 lbs. milk and 570 pounds fat, having an average test of 4.06 percent, something away above the average for Holsteins. Messrs. Gibson and Sons again come in fifth position in the three year old class with "Springbrook

MUSLIN COMES FROM MOSUL

More cases have been reported to the profiteering tribunals in connection with articles of clothing of various kinds than with anything else.

Few people realize that the names of the materials from which clothes are made come from nearly all parts of the world, showing how many different nations it required it one time to provide the clothes one now wears.

Cambrie, for example, in named after the famous city of Cambrai, in France, made doubly famous since 1914. Muslin, on the other hand, is named from Mosul, right away on the banks of the Tigris in Asia, while calico comes from Calicut, a town in India, which was once celebrated for its cotton cloth.

Damask, as most people know, takes its name from Damascus in Syria, while silk and serge are both derived from the same Latin word serer, meaning the Chinese. It was from northern China that these two fabrics first came to Europe.

Velvet is also a Latin word meaning fleece, while alpaca comes from an animal of the same name which lives in Peru, in South America.

FOR HEAVY BLOUSE.

The blouse of heavy fabric—not necessarily really heavy fabric, but in any event lacking the transparency of net or georgette—is one of the favorites of the winter season. Among the materials favored, satin and the various weaves of velvet are exceptionally smart. In emphasizing this fancy for the heavy blouse, however, it must not be understood that the sheer, dainty models of lace, net, georgette, etc., have in any way lost caste. The heavier models have merely been added, giving even greater variety to the already lovely display.

The sketch shows a very smart blouse which may be developed attractively in velvet with bead or wool embroidery in contrasting color, or in satin with metal, silk or wool embroidery as the trimming. The blouse shown is waist length and finished with a soft, crushed girdle of self fabric, two long fringe-tipped panels disintegrated at the bottom. The slightly flared elbow sleeves are finished with the embroidery, and the neck has a piping of self fabric.

Another exceptionally smart blouse recently seen was of terra cotta colored satin, cut straight and long enough to reach just to the hips. The blouse was trimmed about the lower edge, the short sleeves and the square open neck with Bulgarian embroidery in an attractive blending of colors.

A smart and severely plain cascade blouse shown in one of the smart shop recently was of navy crepe de chine. It was cut as straight and plain as a Chinaman's shirt, reaching just to the hips, and was finished at the lower edge with two big tucks, each approximately an inch and a quarter wide. The elbow sleeves were similarly treated and the open neck was finished with a three-inch-wide accordion plating of self fabric. Narrow tie ends of the crepe de chine were attached at either side, at the normal waistline and were loosely tied at the hips.

An unusual-looking garment also recently displayed in the blouse department was a slipover blouse of knitted silk in Roman stripes, recommended for southern resort wear with a sport skirt of white.

For spring, according to present indications, lingerie blouses will be very popular. The critted models of sheer cottons and handkerchief linen are to be well in the lead.


