ASSET CURRENCY NEEDED.

Over 90 per cent. of all business transactions accomplished through A. Y. P. expositon in Seattle, many banks is consummated by means of checks and drafts, which are in a sense auxiliary currency and possess perfect elasticity, writes A. Barton Hepburn in the Century. Less than 10 per cent. is done by means of money. A very slight degree of distrust, which lessens the use of checks and increases the demand for money, can easily produce a money stringency. Until Congress enacts laws which will enable strong, well-managed banks, with ample capital and possessing abundant good liquid assets, to obtain currency with which to supply public wants, our system will be defective, and all classes must suffer financial loss with every recurring money stringency.

I think there is no disposition to interfere with the law authorizing all national banks to issue circulation secured by government bonds. The banks have purchased these bonds at a price far in excess of their investment value, because of the circulation privilege, and have rights which should be acknowledged and fairly dealt with; but it is evident, I think, that our commercial interests cannot be properly safeguarded until the power exists somewhere to issue notes against natural and normal banking assets—credits or asset currency, if you please.

WIRELESS PHONE TO CHINA?

In the agricultural building at the A. Y. P. expositon in Seattle, many thousands of people have witnessed actual talking without wires. Mayor Miller conversed from one part of the city hall to another without wires. The manager of the local office, 905 Third avenue, made the following statement yesterday: "I am firmly convinced that it will be only a matter of a short time when we will have the whole Pacific coast connected with wireless telephones. At the present time we have plans and specifications for the erection of a 360-foot tower in Seattle. This tower is used as a long distance receiving depot. With this erected we can talk from Seattle to Spokane, to moving ships, and, within a very short time with China or Japan.

IN MEMORY OF THE LATE WM PATRICK.

The late William Patrick, Hampton, who fell asleep in Jesus, at 11.30 a. m. Sept. 17th, in home just across the street, opposite the manse, was ill for two years. Sixty-six years ago he was born in Ayrshire, Scotland, and when so young that he had no recollection of his birthplace, with his parents came to Pictou Co. His father eventually was an underground manager in the coal mines in Stellarton and William bookkeeper, after he had attended school of a select kind, with a brother of late Principal Grant, Senator McGregor and other ambitious youths. He married Mary, sister of Rev Dr A. Falconer of Halifax, and began mercantile life in the old "Cameron Block" in Charlottetown, in company with his brother-in-law, the late James Falconer. Having a branch store in Hampton, over 37 years ago, with his parents he removed thither and owned and occupied the building now called "The Manse" and did business in a comfortable church. Here his parents and sister died. He abandoned mercantile and devoted all his energies to farming. Eighteen months ago he sold his farm on the Green Road and rented a house belonging to Mr A. Myers at Hampton Corner. For six weeks every and all night in a very busy season people in sufficient numbers attended him. Altho he was but a short time confined to bed, being unable to remain therein, he required and received a great deal of faithful attendance. This together with the very large attendance at his funeral in the Presbyterian Church in Hampton, at 3 p.m. on 19th (even tho another similar service was being conducted three miles away at same hour) was a good reminder of the degree of the esteem in which he was held by his fellow citizens. Mr Patrick was a very industrious, intelligent, honest man. He was widely read, conversant with many subjects and lines of literature, a very helpful practical citizen. The wife of the late Hon Matthew Smith said to me at the funeral "Mr Smith said Mr Patrick was the most upright man he ever knew." Professor Pollok who, visited him here sixteen years ago said: "He was one of the best of my boys in my Bible Class in New Glasgow, when I was pastor there, and regularly walked from Stellarton to attend." He was not only Conservative in politics but also in speaking of "The things pertaining to the Kingdom of God," and reminded me much of some "Corny Scots" who expressed less than they experienced. He ventured fifteen months ago, altho, very weak physically, to profess faith for the first time at Sacramental table of The Re-
