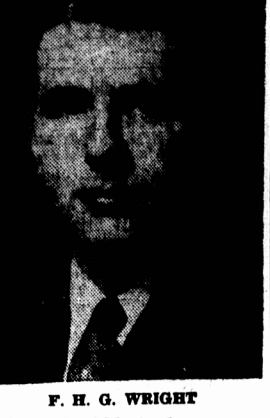

**PAYS \$20,000 IN FINES**

DENVER, Nov. 2 — (AP)—Henry M. Blackmer, bent-shouldered oil millionaire, today paid \$20,000 in fines to close his income-tax-evasion accounts with the United States Government. He was spared a jail sentence because of fading health. He is 80 years old. Justice Orin L. Phillips pronounced the sentence in Federal District Court in this belated postscript to the Teapot Dome scandal of the 1920s. He added that "I do not believe the ends of justice would be served" by jailing Blackmer, who returned from a 23-year exile in Europe only five weeks ago.
