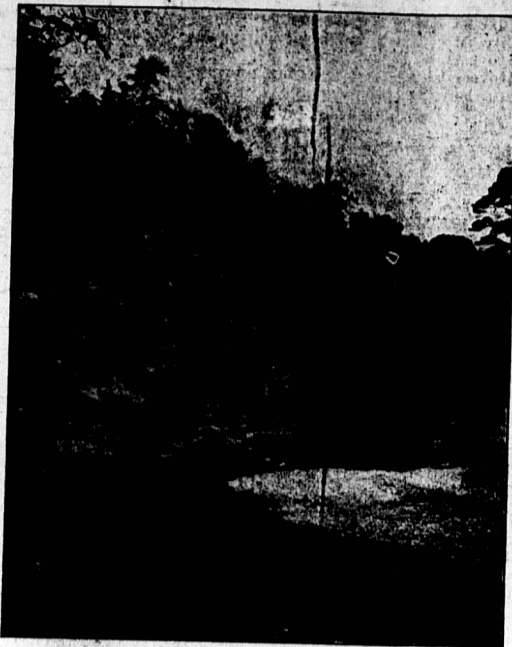

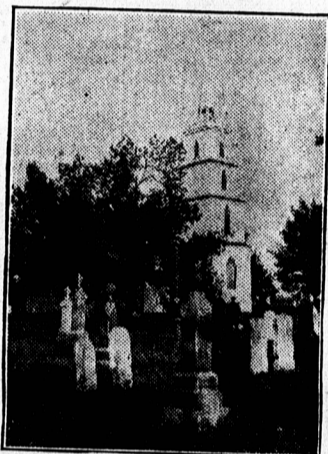

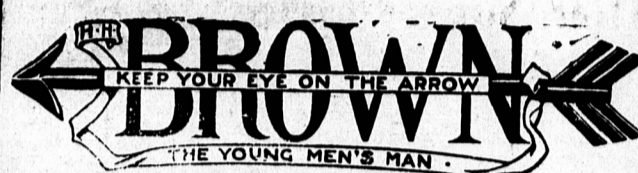

CHEAP EXCURSION

To Magdalen Islands

The Management of the Magdalen Island Steamship Service will give the second and last excursion of the season on their grand new steamer "Lady Sybil" from Souris to Magdalen Islands, on Monday August 2nd.

Steamer will leave Railway Wharf Souris at 7:30 o'clock, after arrival of evening express from Charlottetown, returning to Souris on Wednesday morning August 4th. At what ever time will suit the passenger's fare from Souris and return \$2.00.

On this occasion the steamer will sail all round the Islands, passing the famous Bird Rocks about three o'clock Tuesday afternoon and the passengers will have the privilege of landing at most of the principal points.
