A PROMISING INDUSTRY.

It is a source of universal regret that this Province has no apparent mineral wealth and consequently no mines of its own in which our capitalists can invest their money to give employment to our people in mining. None the less those who are seeking investment in mineral ventures need not go far afield in order to find very promising chances. Within fifty miles and almost in sight of the eastern extremity of Prince Edward Island, on the northwestern shore of Cape Breton is situated the large property of the Cheticamp Copper Company, described by Dr. Gilpin of the Mines Department of Nova Scotia as promising to rank among the largest copper mines in the world. The deposit is about 350 feet in thickness and has been exposed by open cuts and test pits for 900 feet along the line of strike. The good average value of the ore, the splendid facilities for shipment and many other points of interest and advantage are fully set forth in the complete illustrated prospectus just issued by the Company. It is proposed to shortly install a concentrating plant to handle the large quantity of ore now in sight. Hugh McInnis, formerly of this city and now of Halifax, is actively connected with the Cheticamp Copper Company.

The S. S. Montcalm, built for the Dominion Government as an ice-breaker for service on the St. Lawrence River, did not accomplish much till within the past few weeks, when its work proved effectual. The Witness quotes Mr. St. George, a prominent citizen as saying "that the cost of such boats was not to be taken into consideration at all, but rather the valuable nature of the work which they could perform. A lengthened season would be worth millions of dollars to the trade of the country and if this can be accomplished by the addition of between two and three weeks, the money will be well spent." It would also be of great value to Charlottetown, as the principal shipping port of the Island if the shipping season could be lengthened in fall and spring by the use of our winter boats. It would be well worth while next fall for the city to send a special delegation to Ottawa with this sole object in view. Till this is done every other agency seems powerless to bring one of the winter boats here till very late in the spring or to keep it here in the early winter.



SHIRT-WAIST SUIT IN SILK WARP HENRIETTA.

A pretty shade of Dresden blue is used in this smart shirt-waist suit that is plain enough for morning wear, and yet dressy enough for afternoons. The shirt waist has a shallow chemise of lace, and the vest of white pique is slit at intervals, and a plaid silk cravat that encircles the lace collar is threaded through these slits, the ends flying free above the waist. The shoulder is broad and the sleeve of a full shirt pattern. A hint of a bolero is given in the arrangement of the lace on the blouse, and the fullness is drawn smoothly into the ribbon belt. The skirt is in extremely full and rippled gores, close fitting at the hip, and flaring widely at the hem. Lace defines each gore, and a smooth haircloth is inserted in the hem for a depth of several inches to sustain the correct flare without undue stiffness.

BOSTON, April 14.—The old State flag of the 18th Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry was returned to the State today by a delegation representing the regiment. Governor Douglas received the delegation and they were introduced by Lieut. Gov. Guild. In the party were Colonel William B. White, who commanded the regiment. The flag was lost in the second battle of Bull's Run August 30, 1862. Its return to the regiment was effected by Lieut. Gov. Guild, who discovered it in a Confederate museum at Richmond, Va.

THE EDITOR'S MAIL.

BETTER MAIL SERVICE.

STR.—A notice appeared in The Guardian recently about a meeting of the residents of Cross Roads, Lot 48, held in the School-house at which the name of the District extending from Molyneux's Corner to McKenzie's Corner—only a little over a mile,—was changed to Melburn. This arrangement cuts off four rate-payers on the east and about eight on the west, and this was done without a public notice, properly posted. We must allow special privileges to King Edward but not to the common people. To give advice to the presumptuous we may say that in order to change the name in a settlement it is customary and right to have those notices put up six clear days. Observe the law and reason and justice.

Previous to this the name of McGregor's Post-office was changed and called Cross Roads. We would like to know where this originated and the reason. Instead of changing names of settlements and post offices we want a distributing post office near the Hillsboro Consolidated School which would be equivalent to four or five post offices and would entail expense and ought to give perfect satisfaction. Those driving the vans when returning could leave each farmer's mail in a box at his gate. This system would more than double the amount of mail matter. The system we have now is a very poor one with mails only twice a week. Just think, settlements from ten to fifty miles from Charlottetown get the morning paper each day and we only get it twice a week. We are entitled to a better mail service and we must have it Yours etc.

To Wash White Silk

White silk blouses, handkerchiefs and ties are all washed in the same way. Dissolve some borax in hot water and let it cool but not get quite cold, and lay the goods in it to steep for half an hour; have ready a lather of warm water and soap, preferably Castile Soap, and wash them, but rub as little as possible and only between the hands. Rinse well first in blue water and then in clean water. Do not wring, but press between the hands, fold each article smooth, and lay in a clean cloth, press two or three times through the wringer, and iron on the wrong side. If a little methylated spirits is added to the last rinsing water, in the proportion of a dessert spoonful to a pint of water, it will make the silk look glossy and smooth.
