Again, it is said that prohibition interferes with business. No doubt drinking saloons, gambling, dens and bawdy houses each attract some "business" customers to town. To prohibit any one of these resorts interferes with business to that extent. The liquor traffic makes some business. So does crime; so does insanity; so does disease; so does pauperism; so does death. But the loss of such business we have the better.

It is said that under Prohibition the Province loses the revenue that might be derived from licensing the open bar. That is true in part, but the Province is relieved of the appalling responsibility of legalising a death-dealing traffic. That responsibility is placed upon the miserable creatures who will sell in defiance of law. Last year they paid in fines \$4,000, which was quite as much as they would have paid in license fees.

THE LOCAL LEGISLATURE.

MONDAY April 18th

House met at four o'clock with Deputy Speaker Douglas in the chair. Hon. Mr. Peters submitted correspondence asked for relative to the Fishery claims, Stipendiary Magistrates' Courts etc.

Hon. Mr. Comiskey tabled the returns showing statements of items referred to in the Public Works Report. Bills to amend the Summerside Incorporation Act, to incorporate the trustees of Mr. Stewart Presbyterian Church, to amend the P. E. I. Dental Association Act and to incorporate Charlottetown Council No. 824 K. O. C., were reported of a private nature and set down for a second reading to-morrow.

An Act to incorporate the Island Tug Company was read a third time and passed.

On motion of Dr. Warburton the House resolved itself into committee of the whole with Mr. Godkin in the chair, on the Bill to amend the City of Charlottetown Incorporation Act. The Bill provides for the division of Ward 5 owing to the large number of electors into two polling divisions for civic elections. It also construes the words "seven days before" in the case of nomination to mean seven days inclusive of the day fixed for nomination; and also to set at rest any possible doubts, confirms the validity of last civic election.

Mr. Matheson pointed out that the Bill did not make provision for the election of Water Commissioners in Ward 5 and progress was reported and leave asked to sit again.

On motion of Hon. Mr. Hughes the House resolved itself into committee of the whole with Mr. Godkin in the chair on the Bill to extend North River Road and add to Victoria Park.

The Bill was reported agreed to with amendments and set down for third reading to-morrow.

On motion of Hon. Mr. Hughes, the Bill to incorporate the Trustees of the Christian Church, New Glasgow was referred to committee of the whole with Dr. Warburton in the chair and reported agreed to.

THIS session at night last evening. There was a large number of visitors present and they listened to an interesting discussion on Preferential Trade initiated by Mr. Matheson's resolution in favor of such. The question was discussed by M. Matheson, Hon. Mr. Gordon, Hon. Mr. Peters, Mr. Read, Mr. McLean, Mr. A. J. McDonald, Hon. Berj. Rogers, Hon. George Simpson and Mr. McIsaac moved the adjournment of the debate. A Government amendment giving credit for the proposal to the Laurier Government was moved by the Premier. The House adjourned at midnight.

JAPANESE MINES BLEW UP THE SHIP

Placed by Togo's Orders--Japs Landing North of Port Arthur--Discipline Prevents Looting in Korea--A Royal Visit--Clause of Anglo-French Treaty Objected to in St. John's.

TOKIO, April 18.—(Special)—Japanese official advices now prove clearly that the Russian warship was blown up by mines placed by Admiral Togo's orders and all Japan is ringing with applause.

LONDON, April 18.—(Special)—It is now said that a large fleet of Japanese transports has been seen on the way to land troops north of Port Arthur.

The Russians report having opposed a Japanese landing April 13, between Port Arthur and the Yalu River.

JAPANESE DISCIPLINE.

The Japanese soldiers in Korea are said to be strictly under discipline, the army paying for all supplies and no looting being allowed.

ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

THE outward cargo of the Minto yesterday included 121 cases condensed milk, 11 car lots, and 200 packages of way freight. The Stanley brought to Georgetown 1 car door, 200 packages way freight, and 78 bags of mail.

The program included speeches by prominent Liberals of the city interspersed with readings etc. During the evening cigars were passed around and all present immensely enjoyed themselves.

A LARGE number of members attended the special meeting of the Hillsborough Boating Club last evening, which was called to appoint a committee to wait on the City Council in regard to dredging the dock in front of the club house. The following are the members of the committee: D. Nicholson, R. McDonald, L. G. Hazard and J. O. Hyndman. It was also decided to proceed at once with fitting up a dressing room in the club house.

TO VISIT AUSTRIAN EMPEROR.

LONDON, April 18.—(Special)—The Prince and Princess of Wales with suite started today for Vienna to visit the Emperor Francis Joseph.

AN OBJECTIONABLE CLAUSE.

ST. JOHN'S N. F. April 18.—(Special)—The second clause of the proposed treaty with France obliges the French and British fishermen to terminate their operations each year by October 20.

IT MIGHT CAUSE TROUBLE.

This if enforced would cut off the winter herring fishing and would cause trouble with the United States.

The Government is taking the matter up with a view to having the clause amended.

A HORSE owned by J. McWilliams, Royalty with a milk wagon attached caused some excitement on Prince Street yesterday morning by running away and upsetting the cans at the corner of Dorchester and Prince. There was no greater damage than the spilling of the milk.

ON Friday evening, Wm. Herron, farmer for D. C. McKinley of North River, had a narrow escape from drowning. He attempted to cross the ice from Brighton to Dockendorff's and broke through in the channel. He was seen by Harold Dockendorff who hastened to his assistance but was unable to reach him. Meanwhile the neighbors had been alarmed. Geo. White soon arrived on the scene and he and Dockendorff at once launched a dory, shoved it on the ice to the edge of the channel and then broke the ice till they were near enough to throw a rope to Herron. He managed to fasten the rope around himself and was drawn into the boat, when he immediately became unconscious. They shoved the boat back on the ice till they were met by some men with a sleigh. Putting him on this they hauled him to the shore and look him to Mrs. Chas. Dockendorff's where restoratives were applied. After some hours he recovered consciousness and at latest accounts was doing well. Too much credit can not be given Messrs. White and Dockendorff for their bravery and presence of mind in such a dangerous situation.
