Tom Man, who volunteered to go to South Africa in place of the deported was allowed to land at Cape Town without molestation. He was given a welcome by the Labour members of the Parliament.

## THE DOCTOR THE DRUGGIST AND THE LAW

The *Western* says that during the past few weeks, in the Maritime Provinces, considerable attention has been drawn to the doctors and the druggists and their relations to the sale of intoxicating liquors in communities in which their sale is illegal. It has been shown that some doctors have very carelessly or negligently signed certificates for intoxicants, and some who do not even make pretension of being sick and that some druggists disregard the law and sell these intoxicants even without these hypocritical certificates.

We have reason to believe that the members of the noble and self-sacrificing medical profession, as a rule have more respect for themselves, their oath of office and the law of the land than to become parties to such a degrading practice, but it is evident that too many are willing to smirch the fair name of the profession for ten or twenty-five cents, for what, to all intents and purposes, so far as their merits are concerned, are bogus certificates. Whilst many druggists observe the law, and sometimes reluctantly put up doctor's prescriptions for liquor which they have reason to believe are not needed for medical purposes, it is unfortunately true that too many druggists

are not at all particular about the merits of the cases or whether any certificate is presented. There ought to be some way of reaching these people beyond the mere fines which are imposed for violation of the liquor laws of the land. Members of the medical associations and pharmaceutical societies, who have the dignity and honor of their high professions at heart, should bring this question before their annual gatherings and should protest against such a prostitution of the noble art of healing and land.

Beyond this, the question should be brought up in our legislatures and agitation should be made looking to the forfeiture of the right to practice medicine or pharmacy on the part of the men who have been condemned by the courts for the criminal violation of the laws of the land.

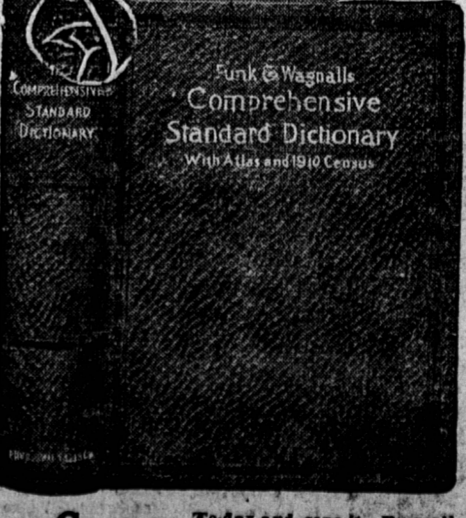
