W. B. Bowness returned home from Moncton last evening where he had taken some horses for sale and where he lost heavily by the fire yesterday morning in which thirty horses were burned to death. The fire occurred in Humphrey & Kincaid's livery stable about 7.30 a. m. and before the alarm was given the smoke and flames were burning from all parts of the building. Efforts were at once made to get out the horses which were kept in the second floor, but not one of the poor brutes were saved. The only horse given a chance for his life was a big grey, owned by Mr. Kincaid which was unloosed and started downstairs but ran back into his stall.

Besides the livery horses there was a number of boarders including some who were long to cavalrymen on the way to camp Sussex and three owned by Mr. Bowness. Mr. Bowness places his loss at \$600. One large mare he had refused \$200 for the previous evening and was to have been delivered to a gentleman yesterday morning for \$275.

The fire is supposed to have started from a lighted match or cigarette carelessly dropped in the part of the building where the cavalry horses were.

On the church grounds tea tables, saloons, etc., will be erected for the accommodation of those attending the celebration. This will be a most enjoyable day for St. Andrews. The magnificent memorial altar donated by His Lordship Bishop McDonald and prices who are natives of the parish, will be used for the first time on that day. It's a gem.
